

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
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- 3. It will then ask you to Complete your Profile. You'll enter your First and Last Name, Birth date and Zip Code.
- 4. Then you will need to Find A School. Type in the search box 58072, which will bring up the schools in Valley City. Please select St. Catherine School.
- 5.A Welcome screen will appear, and you'll hit Let's Go.

- 6. The two pictures (right) are as follows:
 - a. (Left) The main screen you will see each time you enter the app. When you have the receipt and are ready to scan, you'll lay it flat on your counter and hit the Scan button at the bottom of the screen, and choose paper receipt.
 - b. (Right) You'll then take the picture of the receipt and hit Confirm in the lower right-hand corner.
- 7. If there are eligible items that you've purchased, it will automatically send the \$\$ to St. Catherine School and you can then throw away your receipt. One thing to note, there is a 2-week expiration on receipts. Thank you!





Alumni Spotlight: Maggie (Gassmann) Oakland



Margaret Gassmann, 9th grade Class of 1988

My name was Margaret Gassmann when I attended St. Catherine school from 1978 until 1988. I was raised on a fourth-generation family farm, a cherished legacy to our homesteaded family. My father and grandfather attended St. Catherine before me. My son, John Oakland, is "graduating" with the St. Catherine sixth grade class in May of 2023, representing the fourth generation of my family to have attended St. Catherine School.

For better or worse, my parents started me in Kindergarten at age four to get me out of the house and in the company of other children. Sister Debra Berry taught our class of twenty. Ten years later, I was one of the final twelve ninth graders to "graduate" from St. Catherine. My classmates and I studied French with Sr. Eugene

Marie and learned to type on manual typewriters. Sr. Mary Severin helped us in the library and sold us cute, hand-painted ceramic figurines from Maryvale. In those years, we had many lay teachers but also still received instruction from some Sisters of Mary of the Presentation. My second grade teacher, Sr. Albert Marie, made a lifelong impression upon me as one of the most loving, humble, and patient individuals I've ever met. Mrs. Gulmon was new at St. Catherine, when she taught my fourth grade class. We used card catalogues, encyclopedias, and rotary phones. We had never heard of the Internet. "Google" was known only to mathematicians and only as the misspelled name of a very large number. In junior high, we had a blast taking turns playing "Oregon Trail" on the green screens of four large, shared PCs. We had a basketball team, "The Cardinals," and cheerleaders, which filled our gym bleachers with energy and pride. Our ninth-graders chronicled those days in soft-covered yearbooks. Mrs. Cheryl Rowekamp, Mr. Tom Ukestad, and Mr. Jerry Lukes were junior high teachers, and Mr. Ralph Dyrness was our Principal. Around the time our class received our ninth grade "diplomas", parish parents received a letter from Bishop James Sullivan, advising that St. Catherine junior high would be closing due to underutilization. He said he hoped the closure would be temporary. It wasn't.

After St. Catherine, I attended St. John's Preparatory School in Collegeville, MN for two years, returning home as a senior to graduate from VCHS in 1991. I worked various jobs while attending college part-

time, eventually obtaining my Bachelors in Psychology and Mathematics from UND. In those years, I volunteered with a homeless shelter and with the American Red Cross. My most memorable volunteer assignment involved traveling to Manhattan in 2001 to help survivors of the 9-11 disaster. After college, I worked as a case manager for Northeast Human Service Center for nine years while also playing keyboards and singing full-time with the band FIRE. I married my favorite guitar player and best friend Dave Oakland in 2006. Our son John was born in 2011, prompting me to quit the band. I subsequently completed a Masters in Counseling at UND and returned with my family to Valley City to work as a licensed professional clinical counselor (LPCC). Today, I see people having addiction and mental health needs all over North Dakota via telehealth, to provide diagnostic assessments and recommendations for their behavioral health care. I am also a national certified guardian (NCG) with Lighthouse Associates, and I play a few music jobs each year with my family band, Oakland Grove.

My advice to current students: cherish the best experiences you have and learn from the worst ones. Remember you can appreciate diversity while remaining true to your own values and heritage. Practice whatever you want to master, but practice compassion above all. Finally, carry your faith in your heart wherever you go: It will give you direction and peace in difficult times.
