- Parents will be given opportunities to volunteer in various areas and activities of the school during the normal school day by pre-arranging with the teacher and getting approval from the administration.

6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.

- Communicates with parents throughout the school year via newsletters, emails, school website, social media, and school messenger.
- All parent notifications will be provided in a variety of languages if necessary.

Parent Responsibilities


We, as parents, will support our children's learning in the following ways:
