Why a PTO at SAMS? - A PTO has been reinstated at SAMS as a way to provide opportunities for students to gather in a safe space and to raise funds to help offset the costs of field trips for students (see information below). SAMS wants to employ field trips that are beneficial and academic for our students and the PTO is helping to make the field trips feasible.

Why PTO is raising funds - Field Trips by the numbers-

On average a field trip cost \$25/ student in costs. This includes transportation and ticket/expenses for students and chaperons. Our goal is that every student can participate in field trips regardless of the families financial situation. If every student at SAMS participates in one field trip a year that equates to \$25 x 800 students to equal \$20,000.


At the end of the newsletter there are three flyers. **One** advertising our districts SMS Text Message alerts.
