Prop S seeks to raise \$25 million to enhance safety and security for RGSD schools and offices, make important structural enhancements and upgrade technology across the district.

ELECTRIC BUSES COMING TO RGSD COURTESY OF EPA GRANT

Riverview Gardens School District has been awarded six electric school buses in Round 2 of EPA's Clean School Bus (CSB) program. With funding from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, the CSB provides \$5 billion over five years to replace existing school buses with zeroemission and low-emission models. At the start of the 2025-26 School, RGSD's new electric vehicles are slated to arrive in the district.

RGSD has submitted additional requests for 15 electric buses in Round 3 of the EPA funding.

McKinney-Vento is a federal law that helps students who are **unhoused or do not have a stable place to live**. It ensures that these students have an opportunity to go to school and receive an education, just like any other child.

Under McKinney Vento, schools, are required to provide certain support and services to students in transition whose families have **LOST** their housing. This does not include students whose families have voluntarily moved away from the area.

TRACI NAVE NAMED ASST. SUPERINTENDENT OF LEADERSHIP & ACCOUNTIBILITY


Riverview Gardens School District announces the appointment of Traci Nave as the Assistant Superintendent of Leadership & Accountability, effective July 1, 2024.

DEIRDRE LIDDELL NAMED EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF STUDENT & COMMUNITY SUPPORT


Riverview Gardens School District announced the appointment of Deirdre Liddell the District's as executive of Student director and Community Support Services, effective March 4, 2024.

Greetings RGSD Stakeholders,



While the cold temperatures have refused to completely disappear, spring is finally upon us. In addition to warmer weather, we will soon welcome a shift in the clocks, Spring Break, an upcoming election and MAP testing.

The district will observe Spring Break March 25-29. I hope that scholars and staff will use the week off to rest, relax and recharge for the upcoming end of the schoolyear stretch. We've all worked extremely hard during the 2023-2024 school year. Please ensure that you take some time for yourself over the break to do something that you love. There is enough time to check off some of those things that you need to check off your to-do list. However, your well-being matters. I urge you to embrace this break as an opportunity to replenish your energy so that we can all end the year on a positive note.

We must ensure that all scholars are ready to tackle the MAP and End of Course exams. In order to regain full accreditation, scholars, teachers and support staff all have to perform at the highest level. Instructors, custodians, cooks, district security officers, clerical staff and administrators all play a role in setting a school environment that promotes learning.

The window for MAP testing opens on April 1 and runs through May 24. Please contact your school office for the specific testing dates at each location.

The April 2 election is also fast approaching. There is less than one month until voters will go to the polls to decide Prop S. Prop S is a no-tax-rate-increase bond issue that seeks to raise \$25 million to support safe and secure schools. The RGSD Prop S Canvassing Crew has been putting feet to pavement in recent weeks, going door-to-door to share information regarding Prop S with the local community.

It has been a joy to see so many scholars and staff members taking the time to become educated about Prop S and then turn around and share that information with the community. We often ask parents and residents to come into our schools, join our committees and share these voices as we make decisions.
