

Rotary Impact Program for Future CCPS Teachers

Rotary Impact is a scholarship program designed to build upon the Rotary Scholars Program by identifying students in career pathways with the incentive to return back to Christian County. Students who would like to become educators will attend Hopkinsville Community College through the Rotary Scholars Program for two years and finish their undergraduate degree at Murray State University with the opportunity to graduate debt free with the commitment to work four years in Christian County Public Schools. Consideration will be given to four-year Murray State University students pursuing a degree in education. The scholarship will cover the cost of tuition the last two years.

To be eligible to apply for the Rotary Impact Grant, student must

- Have graduated from a high school in Christian County, Kentucky
- Complete the FAFSA
- Provide an official college transcript
- Provide an official high school transcript
- Provide three (3) letters of recommendation
- Submit a two-page essay that addresses the following: 1) Why you would be a good candidate for the Rotary Impact Grant, including accomplishments and academic achievements; 2) Your philosophy for teaching; and 3) How you intend to positively impact Christian County Public Schools' students and families.
- Meet Teacher Education requirements for Murray State University
 - o 2.75 GPA or higher
 - o ACT and/or Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators Tests (CASE) requirement
 - In conjunction with the above requirements, the following <u>assessment requirements (16 KAR 5:020)</u>, <u>effective 12/11/23 through 12/31/24*, must be met</u>:
 - 1. ACT Composite of 22 or higher
 - 2. or use individual ACT scores of ACT Reading 20, ACT English 18, ACT Math 19
 - 3. or use individual CASE scores of Reading* 150, CASE Writing* 158, CASE Math* 144
 - 4. or a combination of ACT and CASE scores as follows:
 - ACT Reading 20, ACT English 18, ACT Math 19 in combination with CASE Reading* 150, CASE Writing* 158, CASE Math* 144
 - 5. or if Overall GPA is 3.0 or higher, can accept CASE scores as follows:

 CASE Reading* 145 or higher, CASE Writing* 153 or higher, CASE Math* 139 or higher

 ACT and CASE scores must be official scores sent directly from the testing company to Murray

 State University. Test scores cannot be over 10 years old. On Campus and/or Residual ACT scores cannot be accepted.
- Commit to work in the Christian County Public Schools System for four (4) years upon graduating college
- Complete a review of the Professional Code of Ethics for Kentucky School Personnel and Declaration of Eligibility

Students will be required to meet the following criteria with Murray State University to continue in the Rotary Impact Grant Program:

- Interview with MSU advisor
- Maintain a 2.75 or higher GPA
- Attend MSU Teacher Education Orientation
- Have completed a minimum of 24 credit hours (through dual credit @ HCC or MSU) with a minimum 2.75 GPA to include the following coursework:
 - o ENG 101 or 102 with a "B" or higher
 - o MAT 150 (or higher level math) with a "B" or higher
 - o COM 181 with a"B" or higher
 - o EDU 180 (MSU) or EDU 201 (HCC) with a "B" or higher
