

## Page Middle School- After School Tutoring and Enrichment Programming

Dear Parent/Guardian:

We are offering after school programming to our middle school students. With the programming, a student also has access to a FREE after school snack and transportation home on the 4:30 bus. This letter provides information about daily routines, transportation, food service, and programming. Be aware that enrichment programs have limited seats available and some students may be placed on a waiting list. Everyday attendance is expected once a student is enrolled in an enrichment program. Take a look at the calendar to ensure the program dates work with your family's schedule.

Enrollment is happening now for enrichment programs! Complete the application using the QR code provided in this packet or use the paper enrollment form and return it to your school as soon as possible. **Programming begins as early as September 6 for some programs.** A school staff member will follow up by phone to confirm enrollment.

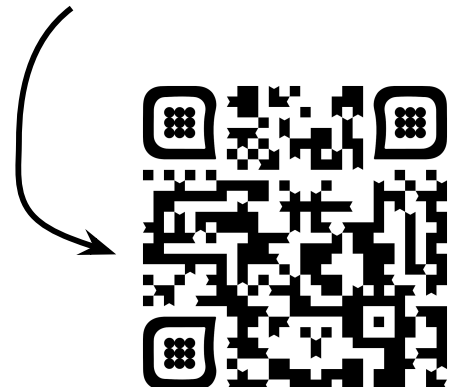

**Begins August 29: Panther Scholar's Hub-** students can work with certified teachers on points of confusion, homework, and/or study skills without an appointment.

## Enrichment Program Offerings

**Begins September 12: eSports-** students will participate in league practice and play with Generation eSports while also learning STEM and career skills, self-efficacy, digital citizenship, and leadership through Gaming Concepts courses.

**Begins September 12: Odyssey of the Mind-** students will learn critical thinking and creative problem solving skills while competing as a team in the Arizona Odyssey of the Mind Association.

**Begins September 6: Code.org-** students will learn coding and other computer science skills. Code.org curriculum and robotics sets will be used in this program.

## Attendance Expectations and Procedures

Attendance is expected everyday of a program. If a student enrolls in a program and doesn't show up for programming or a student misses more than 3 days of programming, the school will make efforts to contact the family. If contact is unsuccessful, the school will open the spot for a student on the waiting list to attend.

## Behavior Expectations and Procedures

We aim for engaging learning environments during programming. In order to achieve this, we expect our students to come to programming ready to participate and learn. The school will utilize their established Code of Conduct in order to deliver engaging learning environments for all students. The school will also utilize their established procedures for intervening on and addressing behavior issues that do not meet the Code of Conduct.

## **Transportation Information**

### **After School Pick Up**

Students are to be picked up at the front of the school no later than 4:30.

### **After School Bus Routes**

The Page Unified School District offers transportation after school to all eligible students approved to ride; however, the route information is different from the regular school route. If your child will be riding the 4:30 Activity Bus for the first time, please familiarize yourself with the following schedules and service areas. Make sure to select your primary method of transportation on the enrollment form. If your transportation method needs to change, contact your school to communicate the changes. Depending on the timeliness of your communication, the request may or may not be possible.

- Stop at Highway stops along 89, turn right on 89A, bead stand (MP525) for Marble Canyon, turn around,
- Stop Bitter Springs Housing's main entrance
- Stop at highway stops on 89 towards Cedar Ridge, turn around at Cedar Ridge & return
