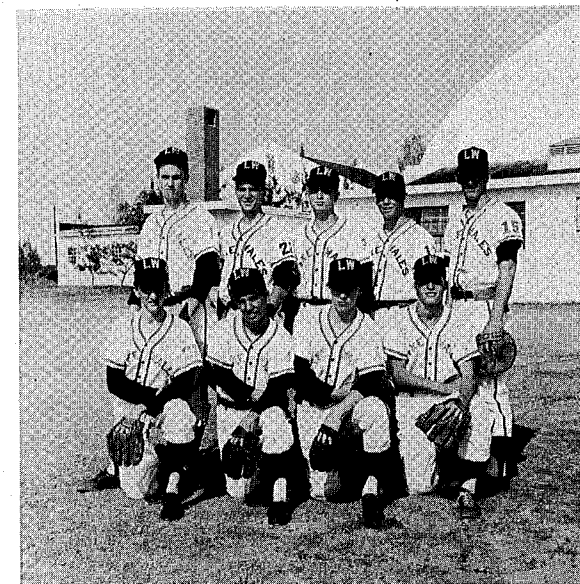


BASEBALL

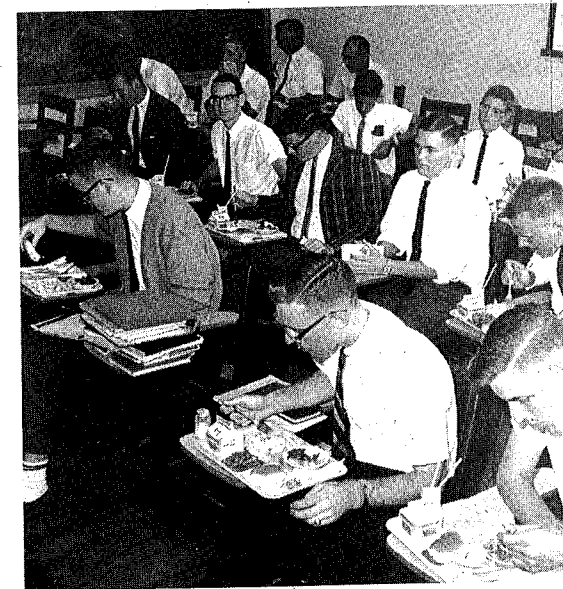
KEY CLUB

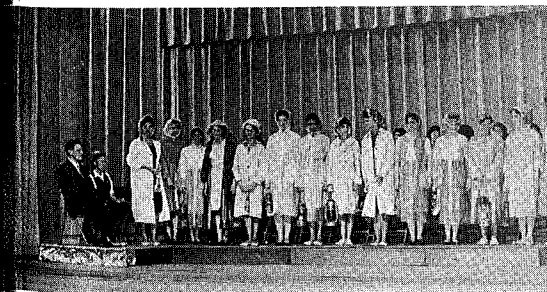
BEACON CLUB

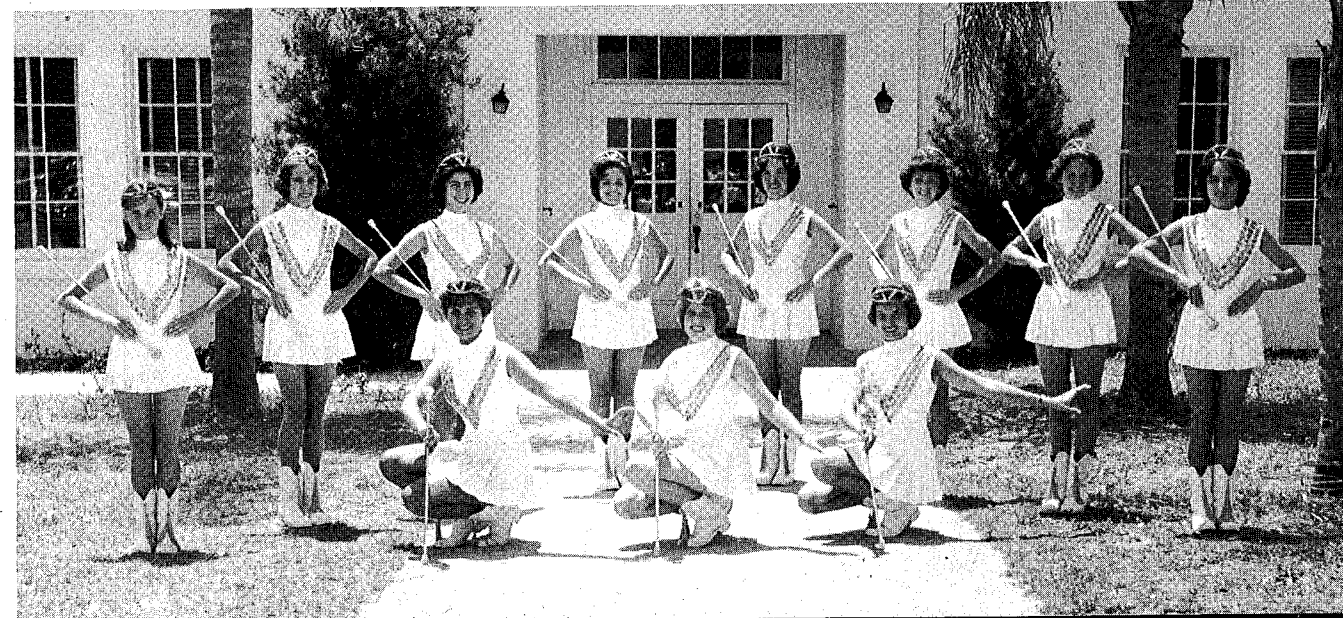
HIGHLANDER BAND
