6th Grade Policies

Chromebooks: *6th grade will be required to submit most work on Chromebooks. Therefore, students will be issued a Chromebook and charger at the beginning of the year and are responsible for bringing both to class each day. Chromebooks must be charged each morning before class or students will receive a check on the clipboard. If you would like to purchase your child his/her own chromebook to use, you may.*

Headphones/Mouse: *Due to the use of chromebooks, students will need both headphones and a mouse. We suggest getting a wired mouse and wired earbuds (this is also what is used at the middle school).*

Cell Phones: *If your child wishes to bring his/her cell phone to school, it must be turned off as soon as they enter the school building and placed out of sight. If this rule is violated, the student will first receive a verbal warning. After the 2nd offense, the student's cell phone will be taken up and given to the principal/vice-principal.*

Dress Code: *6th grade follows the dress code implemented in the Rutledge Elementary School Handbook. Thus, any student wishing to wear shorts must make sure the hem length is at proper length. This means the student should be able to stand straight, place his/her hand to their side and their middle finger tip should not go past the hem line. If this rule is violated, the student will first receive a verbal warning. After the 2nd offense, the student will be sent to the nurse to call home for a change of clothing.*

Classroom Check System:

1. Failure to have all materials/supplies at your desk.
2. Failure to follow directions first time given.
3. Failure to talk at appropriate time/volume.
4. Failure to keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself.
5. Failure to stay on task and complete assignments on time. *(This will result in the student attending recess detention.)*
6. Disrespectful to classmates and/or adults.
7. Technology Violation *(See RES Handbook for further actions for this violation.)*
8. No chewing gum in the classroom.
9. Out of the designated area.
10. Running and/or horseplay
11. Relationship Violation *(See RES Handbook for further actions for this violation.)*
12. Theft *(Immediate office referral)*
13. Fighting *(Immediate office referral)*
14. Obscene/profane language/gestures *(Immediate office referral)*
15. Cheating *(Immediate office referral)*
16. Uncharged Chromebook

Consequences:

- 10 minutes of recess detention for each check (per day)
- 4 checks in a day = Office Referral
- 6 checks in a week = Office Referral
