What is it?

This plan describes the different ways that Bowdon Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan And participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Bowdon Elementary School invited all parents to attend a Title 1 Input Meeting on April 16 & May 7, 2024 to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school-wide plan, our school-parent compact, the family engagement budget, and the building of staff. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year. Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Bowdon Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is available to all students on-line or a paper copy may be requested through the front office. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center and in the front office.

2025-2026 District Goals

CCS goals is to increase the number of students scoring proficient or distinguished on the math GMAS by 3%. CCS goals is to also increase the number of students scoring proficient or distinguished on the ELA GMAS by 3%.

2025-2026 School Goals

Bowdon Elementary school goals will be to raise the GMAS scores of all students by 3%, increase 2025 STAR Reding and Math goals by 3%. Our 2025-2026 focus area will be reading instruction for K-2 with the decodable readers, phonics skills, and writing. Another focus area will be 3-5 Reading and ELA skills with an emphasis on Lexile levels and Language & Writing needs. In 3-5 math, we will focus on numerical reasoning, geometry and spatial reasoning, and measurement for 2025-2026 school year.



Area of Emphasis

Grades K-5 will focus on early literacy skills with emphasis on phonics, fluency, and writing.
Grade K-2 will focus on increasing understanding of number sense.
Grades 3-5 will focus on increasing understanding of numerical reasoning, geometry and spatial reasoning, and measurement.

ELL, ED, and Students with disabilities will receive additional supports, materials, and strategies in the area of Reading, ELA, and Math as needed.

Bowdon Elementary will host the following events to build the capacity for strong family engagement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. All meetings for parents and family members will be held at BES.

Open House - July 29, 2025

Annual Title I Meeting – August 12, 2025 (2 Sessions to Choose From)

We invite you to a morning and/or evening of learning and sharing about our Title I program, including our parent and family engagement policy, the school wide plan, the school-parent compacts, and parents' requirements. Invitations will be sent home with each student, posted on social media, and advertised on our school marquee (Building Parent Capacities). The Annual Title 1 Meeting will be held August 12 at 8:00 am and 3:00p.m. in the BES library.

Reading Night -September 23, 2025

Learn how to make reading fun at home. At home strategies will be shared for parents to help students develop into a successful reader. Included also are technology supports and innovative programs for students to use at home to improve reading skills. Parents will be informed about curriculum and goal setting in all subject areas as well as training on how to access curriculum for all respected subjects.

Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, & Technology (STEAM Night)/ Science Fair-November 4, 2025

Parents will enjoy hands on learning with students in the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics. At home learning activities will be shared with parents to encourage inquiry in and out of school.

Math Night- February 10, 2026

Learn how to help your child with math homework. At home strategies will be shared for parents to help students reinforce math concepts Included also are technology supports and innovative programs for students to use at home to improve math skills.

Milestone Testing/Future Focused Night/ Student Led Conferences - April 14, 2026

Learn about test taking strategies and formats at the annual Milestone Testing Night. This workshop will encourage good taking strategies in the area of math and reading.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Bowdon Elementary staff, families, and students will develop a school-parent compact.

This agreement will explain how parents, teachers, and students share a common partnership and work together to help student reach grade level goals, future focused goals, and challenging state academic reading, math, and science goals. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers. The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept with each child's teacher if parents need another copy.

Stakeholder Decision Making

Each year Bowdon Elementary School surveys parents, students and staff to gather information about Bowdon Elementary. This information is used to guide the School Improvement Team in developing a School-Wide Title One Plan. In addition, Bowdon Elementary holds a Parent and Stakeholder Input Meeting to gather direct feedback from parents on the School-Wide Title One Plan, Title One Budget, School Compact and Parent and Family Engagement Plan. We also routinely survey parents about different opportunities for them to be involved in our school and continued family engagement activities to promote school/community partnerships. The Bowdon Cluster Schools have formed an Advisory Council that meets quarterly to ask for parent input in ways to make our school better. All input obtained is used in combination with survey data toward the development of the most comprehensive plans possible for Bowdon Elementary. Additionally, all stakeholders will have an opportunity for input on our 1 % parenting budget through Title funding.
