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Kindergarten Mrs. Tinnin

This week we are working on our last unit in math. Students are practicing how to sort different shapes into categories using different rules. This unit is very short. After we are done, we will review subtraction, play math games, work on math centers, and continue with math talks until the end of the year.

We are learning how to write uppercase letters during ELA. We are also learning to read more tricky words- why, when, where, word, one, and to. Students are practicing how to write sentences and drawing an illustration to show their understanding.

We sent home our pumpkin plants. Students had fun observing the growth and watching new leaves form. We have something else coming in next week for them to observe. I've been waiting for the warmer weather so they will survive.
