WHAT IS PROP S?

Prop S is a No-Tax-Rate-Increase Bond Issue on the April 2, 2024 ballot for residents of Riverview Gardens School District. If passed, Prop S will raise \$25 million to enhance safety and security for RGSD schools and offices, make important structural enhancements and upgrade technology and security systems across the District.

PROPOSITION FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Q: WHAT IS A GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND?

A: A "general obligation bond" is debt of the School District that is payable from taxes levied against all property located within the boundaries of the School District. The proceeds received from the sale of the general obligation bonds will be used to pay the costs of various capital improvements to School District facilities.

Q: WHAT WILL THE COST BE FOR TAXPAYERS?

A: This bond issue requires no tax rate increase and the principle of and interest on the bonds will be payable from the School District's existing debt service levy, which is currently \$1.1392 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation of real and personal property.

Q: What vote is required to issue the bonds?

A: This bond issue requires no tax rate increase and the principle of and interest on the bonds will be payable from the School District's existing debt service levy, which is currently \$1.1392 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation of real and personal property.

Q: HOW WILL THE NO-TAX-RATE-INCREASE BOND ISSUE APPEAR ON THE APRIL 2, 2024 BALLOT?

A: Shall the School District of Riverview Gardens, St. Louis County, Missouri borrow \$25,000,000 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, renovating, furnishing and equipping school sites, buildings and related facilities for school purposes, including safety, security, roof, HVAC, parking and technology improvements, and issue general obligation bonds for the payment thereof? If this proposition is approved, the adjusted debt service levy of the school district is estimated to remain unchanged from the current debt service levy of \$1.1392 per one hundred dollars assessed valuation of real and personal property.

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PROPOSITION FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Q: WHAT WOULD THE NO-TAX-RATE-INCREASE BOND ISSUE PAY FOR?

A: Prop S would help to address issues related to safety and security, structural enhancements and technology improvements. To enhance safety and security, Prop S funds would be used to secure the entries to schools, construct and extend perimeter fencing, replace classroom doors, replace exterior doors, upgrade doors for fire safety, replace blinds and window coverings, replace and upgrade locks and upgrade to LED lighting districtwide. Prop S funds would also include upgrading the school's intercom systems.

Structural enhancements would include, replacing HVAC systems, replacing and repairing roofs, enhancing athletic fields, renovating kitchens at all schools and renovating the security and welcome center at Riverview Gardens High School.

Q: What would the timeline be for the proposed projects?

A: When Bonds are issued by the school district, the District has to assert that it expects to spend the proceeds within a 3-year period. We expect to follow this guideline per the requirements of the bond sale.

Q: How did the district prioritize the proposed projects?

A: We looked at the most pressing safety projects in the District, looked at the tentative costs of each of these projects and then determined from there which ones would potentially come first.

	Enhance salary schedule to retain & recruit high-quality staff.	RGSD teachers and staff have received consistent raises from 2021-Present. The minimum wage in the district was raised to \$15 per hour, step amounts have increased for teachers. Recruiting and referral stipends have been given. Starting teacher salaries (for new teachers) in RGSD has risen from \$38,433 to \$46,935.00.
