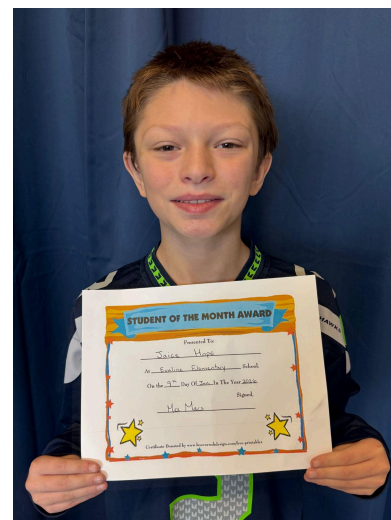

TK and Kindergarten

In math, Kindergarten students are developing their understanding of addition and subtraction within 1–5 by using number sentences and visual representations to find missing numbers. They are also engaging in *Which One Doesn't Belong?* activities, which promote critical thinking as students explain which picture does not fit. Multiple answers are possible, encouraging flexible thinking and discussion. TK students are learning to identify and count the numbers 6 and 7.

In reading, Kindergarten students are learning to read consonant clusters such as *clap*, *snap*, *swim*, and *step*. As part of this unit, students are beginning to read decodable books with short stories. They are also practicing answering questions orally using complete sentences as a foundation for future written responses.

TK students are continuing their plant unit while developing early literacy skills, including identifying beginning sounds and learning the letter sounds A, M, and T. They are also practicing writing their names, saying each letter as they write. Both TK and Kindergarten students continue to work on rhyming and identifying patterns.

First and Second Grade Explorers

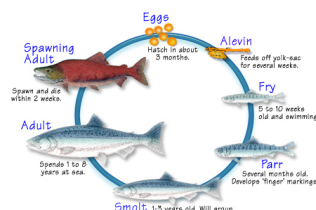

By the end of this month our first and second graders should have 25 AR points or more. Please check the AR report that was sent home in your child's Boomerang Folder this Friday to see your child's progress. Please also look for the spelling lists that are sent home on Mondays.

Students should know their continents and oceans. They began animal reports about animals that live on different continents. Students are so excited about their research!

Second grade students should be able to compute differences from two-digit subtraction equations with and without regrouping. First graders should be connecting related facts to addition and subtraction problems. Please work on these skills with your child and/or apply these concepts to story problems.

We are beginning to see changes in our salmon eggs! If we look closely we can see the shape of a fish inside the eggs! Also, some of the babies are beginning to move inside the egg! It is so fun to watch students' excitement as they monitor these changes.



Third and Fourth Grade Classroom

This week, students worked on an informational writing piece focused on the job of meteorologists. They wrote 3–5 paragraphs while practicing how to develop a strong main idea, use transition words, and properly cite sources. Students have made tremendous progress in their writing independence this year, and I am very proud of their growth.

In both grades, students are discovering that math becomes much easier when multiplication facts are memorized. Even spending just a few minutes each night practicing multiplication facts can make a big difference in your student's success in math.

We are excited to share that the water testing program we have participated in for the past several years has secured funding to resume. Students will visit Olequa Park on February 13th to conduct water testing. We will then compile our data and prepare to present our findings at the GREEN Congress on March 19th. This is an incredible learning opportunity for our students, and we are thrilled to be able to participate again.

Fifth and Sixth Grade Classroom

This week we have been very busy in math learning about decimal division and ratios. 5th grade students have practiced moving a decimal around and dividing decimals by whole numbers and 6th grade has learned to solve ratios, proportions, and solving for unknown numbers

Students have been learning about the revolutionary war in Social Studies and practicing writing informational essays through research. So far the writing looks very good and they have learned how to use graphic organizers to simplify the writing process.

We had lessons this week on Martin Luther King Jr and the Civil rights movement in preparation for MLK Jr. Day on Monday. In Science we have started a new unit on physical science and the properties of matter.
