What is a Title I School?

Title I is a program that provides federal funds through the Georgia Department of Education to local educational agencies and public schools with high numbers or percentages of children in poverty to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic content and student academic achievement standards.



How is Title I Parent and Family Engagement Money Spent?

NHS uses its Title funds for:

- Personnel
 - Intervention Teacher supports students who need to recover credits
 - Intervention Specialist work on graduation plans for students who are under-credited & over age limit.
 - Family Engagement Liaison plans family engagement workshops and other activities that support student academic achievement and creates a welcoming environment
- Supplies
- Books/materials for classroom
- Technology
- Training for teachers course team planning days



What are our Title I School wide goals?

Our goals are high quality instruction for all students and providing intervention and support for students who need them.



What programs/supports are in place to help my child?

- Structured after-school tutoring program
- IXL Software that utilizes MAP scores to build student's foundational knowledge and close gaps in learning
- PBIS to positively impact behavior goals




What curriculum does our school use?

NHS follows Georgia's Standards of Excellence with the help of various textbooks and resources



What tests will my child take?

- Normal classroom assessments
- MAP tests for 9th and 10th graders in ELA/Reading and Math
- EOC in Biology, Algebra 1CC, US History, and 10th Grade Literature & Composition II
- AP tests for those in the courses
- PSAT for all 10th graders
- SAT/ACT/ASVAB based on student needs



How do these tests measure my child's progress?

- Classroom Assessments: Teachers analyze the data of common summative and common formative to remediate and monitor student progress.
- MAP Growth measures: Achievement: Your child's current understanding and performance in a subject compared to other students nationwide at the same grade level. Growth: The progress a student has made overtime, from one testing period to the next.
- End of Course Tests (EOC) test students on their knowledge of the standards. Students are provided with a numerical score for grading and the designation of "Beginning Learner", "Developing Learner", "Proficient Learner", and "Distinguished Learner" for each EOC they take.

What proficiency level is my child expected to meet?

The NHS expectation is proficient or above for EOCs.



What is required, by law, for Parent and Family Engagement?

Northside High School is required to provide families opportunities to be engaged in the education of their child by providing:

- Annual Title I Meeting to explain what it means to be a Title I school
- Academic-based activities covering Literacy, Curriculum Standards, Technology, Testing and ESOL
- Welcoming Climate
- Shared Decision-Making opportunities to include surveys and input meetings
- Professional Develop for Staff on the importance of family engagement

What is the District's Parent and Family Engagement Plan?

Northside High School will


- * Host literacy and math family events to support student learning and provide exposure to various strategies and methods of teaching and learning.

- * Keep up with their grades by checking Infinite Campus frequently.
- * Attend Evening Advisement in order to make informed decisions about class schedules as well as graduation and post-secondary education and workforce opportunities.
- * Support the school's effort to partner with families and the community. Show up and be present.



Does my child's teacher meet professional qualifications?

Yes, 100% of NHS teachers and paraprofessionals are highly qualified.



What is a Parents Right to Know?

The federal education law – TheEvery Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires that all parents in a Title I school be notified and given the opportunity to request information about the professional qualifications of classroom teachers and paraprofessionals instructing their child.



What opportunities does the school provide for parent engagement?

Northside hosts academic events and activities meant to provide parents/families opportunities to engage with their child to support student learning and success. Northside parents are encouraged to volunteer and participate in school activities both during the school day and after school.

Northside parents are encouraged to participate in our School Council and Parent Action Team along with contributing their feedback during our Shared Decision Making process in the Spring.




How does the school build staff capacity for parent and family engagement?
