# **Course Title**

American Literature A/B (11) (P)

# **Description of Target Group**

This yearlong course, required to meet the district's graduation requirement, is designed for all students who have passed Introduction to Literature (9), (H), or (L2).

# Purpose

This course is designed to complement the curriculum of United States History. Through a multi-text approach, students will read and write accessing themes which include individualism, the American Dream, social issues, as well as personal and human values. Critical writing and reading, listening and speaking skills will focus on using analytical and evaluative thinking. Both group and individual projects will be assigned. In addition, students will explore career and college information and opportunities to develop life-long learning skills.
