Policy for Providing Free Meals thru the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) offered to students of Moseley Public School October 1, 2025

Moseley Public School announces its participation in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP). Through this program Moseley Public School will have the opportunity to feed all students a free/nutritious 3rd meal at the end of each school day for the 2025-2026 school year. All participants in attendance are served meals at no extra charge to the parents. Parents will not be required to complete a household application. The meal is paid for through a USDA program called the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) that is administered by the Oklahoma State Department of Education Child Nutrition.

In accordance with Federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, the USDA, its Agencies, offices, and employees, and institutions participating in or administering USDA programs are prohibited from discriminating based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, age, or reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity in any program or activity conducted or funded by USDA.
