Local Liberty teen earns state trapshooting championship

LIBERTY — William “Will” Coble, 15, of Liberty captured the state trapshooting championship May 6 in Reidsville.

Coble outshot roughly 100 teens from around the state to clench the

championship. The shooting match is put on by the Scholastic Clay Target Program, an organization for young people to come together in shooting sports around the world. SCTP is the main organization where most Olympians

are chosen from each year.

Coble is a rising sophomore at Providence Grove High School and enjoys all types of shooting sports, including skeet, trap and clay target, as well as rifle and pistol. He also enjoys

long-range rifle shooting. He was the 2022 champion last June for the NRA's Youth Hunter Education Challenge in Corning, N.Y.

Coble is the son of John Coble of Liberty and Karen Calkins of Burlington.
