

Shippensburg High School Child Development Free Nursery School Program

Shippensburg High School Child Development Nursery School program is a course offered at the high school for students at the high school and children in the community. High school students learn about the development of preschool aged children then apply their knowledge in a student run, teacher monitored nursery school program. Students provide a safe and nurturing environment for children to become familiar with preschool structure and enjoy activities and learning through play, stories and songs in addition to small and large group activities and play. There is no charge to

participate.

There are three- sessions throughout the year with about a four week break in between each session. A child can be registered for week break in between each session. A child can be registered for all or the desired sessions at one time. We also accept children throughout the year as they become old enough to join the program. Children who attend must be three, four or five years old. Other requirements include having their own transportation and the child must be completely toilet trained. The program runs four days a week, typically Tuesday - Friday, unless otherwise noted on specific session calendar. The time is from 8:55-10:15 AM. The program is available for 12 children in the community. Registration occurs on a completed forms received basis. The WBL program allows students to obtain career focused volunteer or paid part-time work during the school day. In addition to our WBL program, I facilitate all things associated with career education, such as career based field trips, mock interviews for our juniors, our annual Career Day, and the 9th grade STEM Day to name a few.





A message from our social worker, Mrs. Carbaugh...

Because of the current government shutdown, some families may experience delays in receiving their SNAP (food stamp) benefits. In Pennsylvania, SNAP benefits for October were given out as usual, but if the shutdown continues, benefits for November might be delayed or paused. This means families who rely on SNAP to buy food could face challenges in the coming weeks.

What you can do:

Supplement Nutrition Assistance Program

- Watch for updates from the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services about your SNAP benefits.
- Try to plan your food budget carefully in case of any delays.
- If you need extra help, please consider Shippensburg Produce Outreach for food on Tuesdays or check out meal calendars offered by local churches. You can also call 2-1-1 for community resources.


RIVER BARRY TO PERFORM AT THE HIGH SCHOOL JANUARY 23, 2026

During the school day, River will deliver an unforgettable performance that combines bubbles, magic, and dance into a one-of-a-kind experience for our students.


