Dear Parishioners,

Happy Solemnity of Pentecost - or more appropriately, the Solemnity of the Descent of the Holy Spirit.

Pentecost is the Greek name given to the Jewish Feast of Shavuot - celebrated the day after the seventh week after Pasach or Passover. Like Passover, it was a pilgrimage feast that required those able to travel to worship at the Temple. It celebrates the first harvest of the spring wheat, but also celebrates the giving of the Torah or Law (the first five books of our Scriptures). It marked the end of the journey from exile into freedom and a start of the spiritual purpose of it all - to live in freedom.

How God prepared the people of Israel for what would be fulfilled in Christ. As the Holy Spirit descends on the Apostles, The Blessed Mother and the other disciples gathered, they become the first fruits, and the new Law is given them be the presence of the Holy Spirit. No longer written on tablets of stone, this new Law is written on their hearts, and that allows them to begin to live the mission - to live in freedom and to proclaim the Gospel to all.

This is still our purpose, too. We are given a share of the Holy Spirit. We are called to live in the freedom of Christ and call others to that freedom. While we were not among the first of the first fruits, we are still among them - and are invited to give our first fruits to the Lord. This is a call to stewardship - a call to recognize God's presence in our life and to give Him ourselves.

Next weekend, we will begin the Stewardship Prayer I included in my notes last week. (It is also included in this bulletin on p. 3). I hope that this will encourage and challenge us to embrace our call to be stewards.

Two weeks from this weekend, Sunday June 22, we celebrate Corpus Christi. We will have a Corpus Christi Procession following Mass at St. Eloi. All are invited to attend. This makes our faith visible, and as we join in walking with the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, we can more easily see how we are to be living in the world as we take Him with us into the world following every Mass. May this simple devotional act prompt us to a deeper Eucharistic reverence.




