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NMHS Remediation Affects District Calendar

On July 18th, Superintendent Alisha DiCorpo sent an update to families and staff regarding the remediation and restoration efforts taking place at New Milford High School as a result of the July 5th roof fire.

The restoration will include the use of multiple portable classrooms on site at the high school. Work has already begun to align sewer, water, and electrical hookups to the portables in preparation for their arrival, which is expected for the very end of August. To accommodate the set up and related moving parts, the district calendar has been revised for all students.

The first day of school for all students will now be Tuesday, September 6, 2022. This change applies to all students, at all schools, PK-12.

Superintendent Alisha DiCorpo says, "Our goal is to minimize disruptions to the school year for all students and staff, while providing relief to those working so diligently on the high school restoration. We truly appreciate the flexibility and patience of all."
