These may include oral presentations, powerpoint, or other modes of sharing findings. Connection of the project to the community is encouraged (La Esperanza, Los Viajes) ● Integration of appropriate technology into the course of study (Google Suite) ● Deeper exploration of the culture, values, and history of the discipline (Esperanza, Stand and Deliver, Los Viajes)
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Course Discipline

Classroom discipline	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Classroom discipline is at the discretion of the teacher, which may range from a warning up to an office referral (pink slip).
Cheating, Lying, and Stealing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Cheating, lying and stealing are wrong and reflect poorly on your behavior and character. ● Any reasonable suspicion of cheating will result in zero credit for the assignment.
Absences	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Makeup work is the sole responsibility of the student. ● All class assignments must be made up when an absence occurs, whether it be excused, unexcused, check in/out, field trip, working in another teacher's class, etc. ● All make up work must be turned in within the guidelines stated in the Handbook. ● For multiple consecutive absences (more than 3 days), the teacher and student will meet together to determine a fair due date for make up work.
