Dear Parishioners,

Welcome to Advent! This Advent is the shortest it can be, and on that note, Christmas season is also the shortest it can be as we will celebrate the Baptism of the Lord on Monday, January 8. Because of this, even more than most years, I encourage being more intentional about keeping Advent and avoiding too much of Christmas until December 25.

Advent is a time of spiritual preparation. It is marked by penance (while perhaps not as intense as Lent). Taking time to pray, to go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, perhaps even fasting and almsgiving, are laudable practices. If we blur the seasons, by the time Christmas is here, have we already peaked our Christmas joy?

As we begin this new liturgical year, we begin a new year on the Lectionary Cycle – Cycle B. Most of our readings for Sundays will be from the Gospel according to St. Mark. This Gospel is shortest of all, and some suggested that it might be the earliest, though there is credible suggestions that St. Matthew's account was first.

St. Mark writes with a certain 'breathless' quality – he uses "immediately" and the word "and" so much that the Gospel comes across as a tale told quickly. St. Mark is often depicted as a lion – and because he roars into the Gospel, it seems to be a fair depiction.

and because he roars into the Gospel, it seems to be a fair depiction. This Friday is the Holy Day of Obligation for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Virgin Mary. As we celebrate the conception of the Blessed Mother in the womb of her mother, St. Anne, we celebrate the action of God in preparing her a most worthy Mother of the Son of God. Please see the bulletin for the Mass times.

With that, I am writing with ample warning. As Christmas falls on a Monday this year, we have a unique situation again. As we are obligated to attend Mass on Sunday (either anticipated on Saturday evening or Sunday typically), and on Christmas (either Christmas Eve or Christmas Day). The Christmas Eve Masses (4:30 pm at St. Eloi or 10:00 pm at St. Edward) meet the obligation only for Christmas, not the 4th Sunday of Advent. So, the situation might be that you attend Sunday morning and Sunday evening for 2 separate celebrations (and therefore could receive both times), or Saturday evening for the Fourth Sunday of Advent and Monday for Christmas or any other combination.

Please plan accordingly to meet both the obligations (Saturday evening or Sunday Morning for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and

Sunday evening – Christmas Eve and Monday – Christmas Day). Note that the Feast of Mary, Mother of God, typically a holy Day of Obligation as well, will not be obligatory this year as it falls on Monday. In Christ,

# YEAR-END GIVING

- The end of the year is not far away, and it is time to start thinking of strategies to maximize the tax benefits of year-end giving. Federal tax laws and many state laws make it possible to reduce or eliminate taxes on gifts to charities like your parish, diocese, schools, and other ministries. Remember that only gifts made by December 31, can help reduce the amount of taxes you owe next April.
- Please consult your professional tax advisor for tax strategies for your personal situation.

# Gifts of Cash

The most popular way to give to charity is still by cash or check. Gifts completed by December 31, will qualify for

tax deductibility for the current tax year. Gifts of cash qualify for up to one-half of your adjusted gross income (AGI). You must receive an acknowledgement for gifts of \$250 or more. For more information about giving gifts of cash, please contact Caren at the parish office.

#### Gift of Grain

Farmers can qualify for income and self-employment tax savings on raised grain if the unsold grain is gifted to your parish. The grain must be delivered to an elevator and the actual storage ticket should be given to the parish. To qualify for the tax savings, it's critical that the parish sells the grain and not the person gifting the grain. #### **Lighting the First Advent Candle**

This candle has traditionally been referred to as "Prophet's **Candle**" reminding us that Jesus is coming. The theological virtue of HOPE is at the center of the first week of Advent. This is the virtue practiced by the prophets and the entire Jewish race for 4,000 years, as they waited in expectation for the promised Savior. And it is the virtue each Christian must practice throughout his or her lifetime and is so well defined in the Act of Hope: "...I hope to obtain forgiveness of my sins, the help of Thy grace and life everlasting."

We embark on our Advent journey as we light the first purple candle. As the first candle is lit, the following prayer may be said:

O God, Rejoicing, we remember the promise of your Son. As the light from this candle, may the blessing of Christ come upon us, brightening our way and guiding us by His truth.

May Christ our Savior bring life into the darkness of our world, and to us as we wait for His coming. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen
