BUS TRANSPORTATION

STUDENT MEDICATIONS

If your student is planning to return to in-person learning and they have medical issues or need to take medications during the school day **we need to hear from you asap!** The medications will need to be delivered to the office by the parent/guardian where the forms can be completed. We will need forms completed for each medication your student takes, even if your student has medication they need to keep with them during the school day ie: inhaler or epi pen, even if it's an over the counter medication, we need to have a form on file. LUNCH

All students may select to receive a **FREE** school lunch when they complete their daily screening check in. To help limit the number of people entering the building **we will no longer be accepting lunches for students that forgot them.** If your student forgot their lunch, please call the office as soon as possible and we will be sure to mark them down for a **FREE** school lunch. Seaside is a closed campus (no food deliveries will be accepted) and students will not be allowed to eat in their cars. Students will eat in either the cafeteria or the middle school gym, be physically distanced and in assigned seats. Students must wash their hands before and after lunch.

In Person Students:

- School will start at 8:10am and end at 1:50pm
- Students will be able to access the building starting at 8am but no earlier
- School lunches will be provided daily at no cost
- Please have your student dress warmly as windows will be open during class to help with air circulation.
- Please have your student bring the following items to school, any other supplies they may need will be provided:
 - Students are required to wear a CLEAN face mask!
 - Bring a backpack – there are no lockers and students will need to carry their items from class to class
 - School issued Chromebook or other personal computer with charger, other than a cell phone
 - Water bottle
 - Writing utensils

DROP OFF/PICK UP

Parent drop off and pick up is on the East/Mountain side of the building. Please pull over to the curb up as far as possible in the drop off lane. This will allow for an efficient flow and keeps the through lanes unobstructed for other vehicles.

ATTENDANCE

*USDA has granted a waiver to the Oregon Department of Education so the Seaside School District can provide a free grab-n-go meal service (breakfast/lunch) due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Meals are served at a designated site and children and/or an authorized adult may pick up meals for consumption off site. **Only one grab-n-go meal is allowable per child; however, an authorized adult may request additional meals for children that were unable to come to the delivery location.***

Pacific Ridge Elementary – Students who attend hybrid, in-person learning at the school will have the option of receiving a grab-n-go meal bag each day when they are released. **Students will be required to notify school staff each day when they arrive that they would like to have a grab-n-go meal.** Please be sure to remind your student because there will be no extra meals available if they do not let staff know when asked. Thanks!



Seaside Middle School / Seaside High School – Students who attend hybrid, in-person learning at the school will have the option of receiving a grab-n-go meal bag each day during a designated lunch period.

The School District's goal is to provide access to meals on all school days, including Wednesdays. We have had to modify our system to accommodate in-person learning, as well as, comprehensive distance learning and on-line thrive students. This meal program does still offer free access to all children 1-18!
