Dear Parishioners,

Our Advent journey continues. We light another candle on the wreath, and we continue to prepare our hearts. I would like to point out the great good of going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I offer them before the daily Masses (with the exception of Wednesdays which are reserved for the St. Edward students).

Do not worry if it has been a while, and do not worry if you forgot how. Neither is a concern to me or any priest who is aware of the great mercy our Lord offers in the Sacrament. Also, don't be ashamed of your sins – we are all sinners, but shame is not of God and forces us to withdraw from Him. Shame, in the end, is the lie that "I am Bad." Guilt, on the other hand the awareness that I did a bad thing, but our Lord loves us and invites us to return. Also, do not be ashamed of repetitive sins.

I frankly do not remember any confessions, and if I do it is only if the Holy Spirit allows it for some good (like being able to offer some deeper help). But also, while not giving in to continued sin, the fact we are not sinning in other ways, or that we fall into the same temptations and sins, can be seen as a positive sign – as long as we are living with the Lord's grace. Just confess and keep growing in God's Grace.

On Tuesday of this week (December 12), we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Our Lady appeared to St. Juan Diego in 1535, just years after the Protestant reformation and the discovery of the Americas. The Church had a presence in Mexico, but conversions of the natives were rare. Juan Diego was one of the few, and indeed he was on the way to Mass when Our Lady first appeared.

After the apparitions, many came to the faith. Much of this is credited to the image that was imprinted on the tilma St. Juan was wearing on that fateful day when the Blessed Mother granted him a sign of her authenticity – roses that were out of season. As he dropped the tilma to reveal the roses to the Bishop, the image of our Lady was there – an image that is rife in symbolism to the natives – a pregnant virgin, a powerful woman who is greater than the sun (a god in their religion), and yet submissive to another.

There are so many other signs in this image. The stars are in the arrangement of that night, the reflection of the Bishop can be seen in the eye of our Lady (like real eyes would reflect), and the fact that the tilma is still intact, despite its humble makeup (agave fibers) which generally decay within decades, yet are intact almost 500 years

later. Let us ask our Lady of Guadalupe for her intercession, and especially for the unborn.

YEAR-END GIVING

- The end of the year is not far away, and it is time to start thinking of strategies to maximize the tax benefits of year-end giving. Federal tax laws and many state laws make it possible to reduce or eliminate taxes on gifts to charities like your parish, diocese, schools, and other ministries. Remember that only gifts made by December 31, can help reduce the amount of taxes you owe next April.
- Please consult your professional tax advisor for tax strategies for your personal situation.

Gifts of Securities & Appreciated Assets

- Gifts of stock, bonds, mutual funds, and certain other property that have increased in value can result in even greater tax savings than gifts of cash. If you have owned such investments for longer than one year you can generally donate them to your parish and deduct their full current value, even if it far exceeds your original cost.
- Congress has provided that in addition to regular tax savings, you also do not have to pay capital gains tax

when these assets are given to a qualifying charity. This "extra" tax savings is another reason why some choose to make their gifts this way.

You can also give assets to your parish that have decreased in value. You may receive a tax deduction of the incurred loss. The total amount of your loss and the charitable deduction may be more than the current value of the donated asset. Donor Advised Fund

Did you have an event that resulted in higher taxable income this year? Maybe it was the sale of a business, company stock, or other appreciated asset. Or maybe your income is just higher this year. Adonor advised fund can allow you to receive a charitable deduction for your giving this year, while providing you the flexibility to use it for charitable giving over time.
