
# HEALTH CAREERS PROGRAM

he Health Careers Program, in its 15th year, now includes Project Lead The Way curriculum. The Biomedical Science courses empower students to build knowledge and skills through challenging projectbased leaning and skills of problem solving, critical and creative thinking, communication and collaboration. Partnerships with area healthcare centers for real life experience remain a popular feature of the program. Recently, two Blue Tie class of '08 HCP Alumnae, Karra and Devon, who are currently in medical school, returned to SMA and shared with students their educational paths!



## **ENGINEERINGPROGRAM**

The Engineering Program, certified by Project Lead the Way, is quickly becoming a popular pathway. Introducing students to the STEM fields, design projects, and cross-disciplinary classroom experiences prepare students for studies in college. In conjunction with Robotics and mentorship from professionals involved in the A.C.E. program, students experience real world engineering challenges and team problem solving.



## CINEMAGIC FILM MAKING

This winter, the Cinemagic Project exposed students from SMA and Cathedral High School to the film industry, learning everything involved in creating and producing a short film. 
# FROM THE ALUMNAE ASSOCIATION


