








Sending Sick Child Home/Return to School Guidelines

When should a sick child be sent home & return to school?

**A goal of SCCSD is to protect children from contagious illnesses, not to exclude children from school longer than is necessary. We hope that this information will serve as a tool to help you decide if our scholars are ready for school following an illness!*

I Need to Stay HOME if.....

<i>I have a fever</i>	<i>I am Vomiting</i>	<i>I have Diarrhea</i>	<i>I have a Rash</i>	<i>I have Head Lice</i>	<i>I have an Eye Infection</i>	<i>I have been in the Hospital</i>
						
<i>Temperature of 100.4 or higher</i>	<i>Within the past 24 hours</i>	<i>Within the past 24 hours</i>	<i>Body rash with itching or fever</i>	<i>Itchy head, active head lice</i>	<i>Redness, itching, and/or "crusty" drainage from eye</i>	<i>Hospital stay and/or ER visit</i>

I Am Ready to Go Back to School When I Am.....

<i>Fever free for 24 hrs. WITHOUT the use of fever reducing medication Tylenol, Motrin</i>	<i>Free from vomiting for at least 2 solid meals</i>	<i>Free from diarrhea for at least 24 hours</i>	<i>Free from rash itching or fever AND I have been evaluated by my doctor if needed</i>	<i>Treated with appropriate lice treatment at home and proof is provided to the nurse</i>	<i>Evaluated by my doctor and have a note to return to school</i>	<i>Released by my medical provider to return to school</i>
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
