

High school students who desire to complete college classes while maintaining their status as high school students may gain dual admission status by submitting:

- 1. A completed Northeast Mississippi Community College application for admission.
- 2. A high school transcript which documents a a junior or senior standing with a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale. Students who have an ACT score of 30 or higher may be granted dual admission if all other admissions criteria is met.

Students must be a high school junior or senior. Homeschool students must submit a transcript prepared by a parent, guardian, or custodian with a signed, sworn affidavit to meet the requirement of this paragraph.

Students interested in Career and Technical programs must have a 2.0 GPA, sophomore standing, and a recommendation letter from their high school.

- 3. A Northeast form of recommendation from the high school principal and/or guidance counselor. A home-school student must submit a written recommendation from the students' parent, legal guardian, or custodian.
- 4. ACT score required (Placement Test not allowed for Dual Enrollment)
- 5. Not allowed to enroll in beginning level courses. Ex: Beginning English or Intermediate Algebra

English course placement

English Composition I:

ACT English sub-score of 17 or above (Or Essentials for College Literacy of 80 or above)

Algebra course placement

College Algebra:

ACT Math sub-score of 19 or above. (Or Essentials for College Math of 80 or above)

Anatomy and Physiology I placement

ACT Composite score of 19 or above.
