How to Read:

- The “tree” on the left gives you options as to the depth of curriculum that you want to see.
- Begin by drilling on broad level skills or strands.
- Drill to find the specific skills or standards that are the biggest deterrent to success.

Questions to Ask:

- What skills gave my students the most difficulty?
- Is there a pattern throughout the class on a particular standard/skill?
- What are the individual student strengths and weaknesses that I can use for data conferences, parent conferences, IEP meetings or RTI?

When to Use: During the year after a benchmark test or common assessment is given.
