Today's Black History Month knowledge is about Tuskegee University, a private historically black university that was founded on July 4, 1881, by the Alabama legislature. The school started as a one-room shanty, with thirty students representing the first class under the leadership of Dr. Booker T. Washington, who served as the first teacher and Founding Principal. Tuskegee University is the only HBCU to offer Reserve Officer Training Corps programs for all branches of the U.S. military. Building on a legacy of excellence and service, Tuskegee continues to honor the proud tradition of the Tuskegee Airmen, who blazed trails as the first African American military aviators during World War II. Their courage, skill, and determination not only contributed to the Allied victory but also laid the foundation for the desegregation of the U.S. Armed Forces.
