- Performance & Progress is the theme for this school year. Six goals are outlined to help guide the focus for collaboration time. Teachers, as campus leaders, have been asked to navigate many changes over the years. As a result of embracing these changes, we have seen tremendous improvement in test scores, number of pathway and A-G completers.
- Vision / Academic and Behavioral Expectations These have been refined for our upcoming WASC visit.
- Ren Learn results for ELA and math were reviewed to identify performance points. Students
  are testing multiple times per year. Teachers on Special Assignment (TOSA) assist with data
  evaluation.
- A summary of site Title I allocations was shared for the committee to review. Some line items including parent involvement, staff development, and salary are percentage-based expenses that are non-negotiable.

## 5. Reports

- Student Report: Student representatives shared they are focused on the upcoming game this Friday versus St. Joseph. A breast cancer awareness campaign will be incorporated.
- ❖ ELAC Report: The first meeting is scheduled for next month. Counseling and ELPAC will be on agenda. This group will review test results and how to read data.
- School Report: The District has employed a search firm to assist with the replacement of the superintendent. Applications are due in October, with interviews to follow. The board's goal is to have the new person in place by the first of the year.
- ❖ Booster Report: Boosters recently provided \$500 in gift cards for PRIDE card winners. PRIDE cards are awarded by staff to students who are caught doing the right thing. It can be as simple as helping a fellow student, assisting with classroom duties or turning in a lost phone or item. Drawings are held every Friday for \$10 gift cards.
