Dear Parishioners.

Monday is the (optional) memorial of St. Nicholas, the Bishop who would become Santa Claus. He is so much more, and it is sad that the myth of Santa Claus is celebrated while the real St. Nicholas is largely forgotten.

St. Nicholas lived in the fourth century. He was orphaned by his wealthy parents during an epidemic, and he devoted the use of his inheritance to helping those in need. He provided dowries to the three daughters of a man who lost his fortune, saving them from prostitution. According to the legend, he threw the money down the chimney to land in the man's stockings or shoes, placed near the fireplace to dry out. (In art, he is depicted often with 3 purses or gold orbs to commemorate this).

There is a myth that he raised a boy who had been murdered and placed in a pickle brine. He made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, and when a storm threatened the ship, they were saved through his prayers. When Myra (in modern-day Turkey) needed a new bishop, he was selected. He preached the truth despite the threats of the Empire of the Arians (who denied the equality of the divinity of Christ to God the Father). According to legend, he was so angered by Arius at the council of Nicaea (325 A.D.), that he slapped Arius. The Council eventually defined that Christ was equal with the Father in the Holy Trinity, and that Mary was appropriately to be called the Theotokos (God-bearer) or Mother of God. He also was a force against the remain pagan elements of his time, tearing down shrines and temples to the pagan gods.

When he died on December 6, 343, he was buried in Myra, but later his remains were transferred to Bari (on the 'heel' of modern-day Italy). He is venerated as the patron of children and sailors, in addition to several cities and territories. He is especially venerated in Russia. While there are 'elements' in the modern image of Santa Claus (the red of a Bishop, the shape of his hat being similar to the bishop's mitre, etc.), St. Nicholas is so much more.

Wednesday is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We recall how God preserved the Blessed Mother from the moment of her conception from original and personal sin – done through a singular act of grace that she was given salvation from that first moment by Christ, who was to be born through her. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. Please note the Mass schedule in the bulletin.

Next Sunday, December 12, is the anniversary of the apparition of our Lady of Guadalupe. Our Sunday FIRE will entail a video on the apparition, and I hope that many will either

attend in person or take the opportunity to watch the video on their own to learn about it, and why it matters.

One thing that I like to point out – before the apparition, the friars had little success in leading the natives of Mexico to Christ – in the tilma of St. Juan Diego, they saw the Blessed Mother as one of them, leading them to God. Millions were converted to the faith, even as in Europe, millions were leaving the Catholic faith and beginning to reject the Blessed Mother.

ADVENT

DARKNESS AND LIGHT

Advent candles readily demonstrate the strong contrast between darkness and light, which is an important biblical image. Jesus referred to himself as the "Light of the World" that dispels the darkness of sin: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life" (John 8:12).

Human history spanned long ages shrouded in the darkness of sin before our prophesied Savior would finally make his appearance to free us from its dominion. As the Messiah's "Advent" (or "coming") draws nearer another candle is lit, with each candle dispelling the darkness a little more. Thus, the Advent wreath helps us to spiritually contemplate the great drama of salvation history that surrounds the birth of God Incarnate, who comes to redeem the human race and make all things new (Rev. 21:5).

It also reminds us that, as Christians, we're meant to shine the light of Christ in this world. As Jesus tells us,

You are the light of the world ... let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven. (Matthew 5:14-16)

Light two candles and sit for a moment in silence. *Christ our Hope,*

Illuminate our hearts with your grace.

Enlarge our visions so that we recognize our kinship with all the people of the world.

December 8, The Feast of the Immaculate Conception – What is it?

The Immaculate Conception refers to the condition that the Blessed Virgin Mary was free from original sin from the very moment of her conception in the womb of her mother, Saint Anne. We celebrate the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary—her birth—on September 8; nine months before that is December 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.

Dear St. Edward School Parishioners,

December 2, 2021

I write to you this year with so much news! 2021 has been a year of progress and just as importantly, we are looking forward to 2022!

There is much talk in the news about student achievement and learning loss. I am ecstatic to report that our students have not experienced that phenomenon. Our standardized test results from the Spring of 2021 and again in the Fall of 2021 show that our students continue to lead their peers in the areas of Language Arts, Math and Science. St. Edward School continues to uphold its long standing reputation for excellent academic achievement.

We are also happy to report that we are fully staffed with not only dedicated employees but several dedicated volunteers. Four staff members received six days of training in August to become certified in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. This is a religious education program that leads children to Christ by encouraging relationship with him. We began implementing this program in the fall of 2019 and were able to open our own atrium in the Fall of 2020. At this point we offer religious education in this manner for our preschool through 2nd grade students. When we have our prayer time I am always amazed at the depth of the children's faith.

I have a very long list of things that we did get to do last year, but in the end, they are the things that we always get to do; they just seemed extra special because most of the world was on lockdown while we continued with our little traditions - albeit in a modified way.

I am so excited to share with you an opportunity that we have been given by the Richard M. Schultz Family Foundation; they have offered us a \$25,000 matching grant opportunity in order for us to invest in initiatives over and above what our current budget will allow. Their goal is to help us achieve excellence in new ways and to grow our enrollment.

The education committee and I have been working to determine the best use of funds raised. We have narrowed the plan down to three important projects. If funds are not received to complete all projects, they will be prioritized at that time.

- The first project includes revitalization of the gym space to include new bleachers (\$9,350) and a new floor (\$9,500).
- The second is refurbishing the middle school plumbing, which is largely original to its 1958 construction. This project would come in three phases; the first would include prepping the boys and girls' bathroom for renovation (\$12,500), the second includes replacing the sewer stacks (\$7,500) and the third includes finishing the project. This includes completely renewing the middle school girls and boys bathrooms, making two bathrooms on the main level ADA accessible, replacing the classroom sinks and a new water fountain/bottle filler in the middle school (\$48,500).
- The final project we need to fund is that of a very part time marketing position for the school. As we know, Catholic school enrollment numbers are down, we are no exception. This is confusing to me in that St. Edward School continues to provide the same quality academic foundation that we always have. Why would families not want that for their children? We believe that a marketing position, once initially funded, would

pay for itself by increasing our enrollment numbers and thereby increasing our tuition numbers. Our goal is to increase enrollment by 10% each year.

While we completely understand that these initiatives far exceed what can be provided by a \$25,000 matching grant, we are praying that your generosity will help us to exceed the initial \$25,000 needed to attain a \$25,000 match.

Here are the specifics. The Richard M. Schultz Family Foundation requires that we reach our goal of raising \$25,000 by December 31st, 2021. They also require that in order for a contribution to count it must be from donors who have increased their giving from prior years or new donors. The good news is that we have ~\$8,300 of the required \$25,000 already pledged by new or increased donors!

As in years past, you may sponsor the school for a day. (Each day is equal to its day number - January 10th = \$10 and December 31st = \$365.) If we find sponsorship for every day of the year, we will raise \$66,795. Or, you may simply choose to give any amount of your choosing.

For your sponsorship, we will pray for you, a loved one you have donated in memory of, or your special intention. Your name, your loved one's name or your special intention will be listed on our school calendar and in the bulletin so all who see it may pray as well. Donations can be completely anonymous, if you so choose.
