RANDOLPH COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT GOALS:

- The percentage of students scoring at Proficient Learners or above on the Georgia Milestones (GAMS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment will increase by five percentage points.

- The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learning or above on the Georgia Milestones (GAMS) Mathematics End of Grade Assessment will increase by five percentage points.

RANDOLPH COUNTY MIDDLE SCHOOL GOALS:

By spring 2024, students in grades 6-8 scoring at Proficient Learner or above will increase five percentage points as measured by the Georgia Milestone assessments in English Language Arts.

- Focusing on reading comprehension, vocabulary development, fluency, and writing

By spring 2024, students in grades 6-8 scoring at Proficient Learner or above will increase five percentage points as measured by the Georgia Milestone assessments in Mathematics.

- Focusing on math computational fluency, problem solving, reasoning, and geometry

By spring 2024, students in grades 6-8 scoring at Proficient Learner or above will increase five percentage points as measured by the Georgia Milestone assessments in Georgia Studies.

By spring 2024, students in grades 6-8 scoring at Proficient Learner or above will increase five percentage points as measured by the Georgia Milestone assessments in Physical Science.

RCMS will improve the climate and culture and maintain a four star rating as measured by state parent, student, & teacher surveys.
