- B. Plan for next year to have a TK at Weston if the numbers require6. Safety
 - A. Big topic in Ripon this year
 - B. Attending every school site and implementing a mock incident in order to review safety plan and strategize best practices incase of an emergency
 - C. This helps us analyze our safety plans more efficiently, and make adjustments as needed
 - D. Eventually one school will go through a full mock incident in order to prepare for whatever could happen
 - E. These scenarios include Ripon Police Department and Fire Department
 - F. Mr. Ramirez- currently updating safety binders as we do yearly
- 7. General Waiver Request
 - A. Mrs. Phelps will be presenting at the next board meeting
 - a. Ripon Elementary has fallen below the 40% threshold to maintain Title I status this year
 - b. This would allow us to maintain Title I status throughout this year
 - c. This changes our funding, allowing us to finish out the school year with the current funding
 - d. Moving forward, Ripona and Harvest could possibly be our only sites that are funded school wide.
 - e. The waiver must be taken to the Parent Advisory Committee Meeting, next Board Meeting, and then onto our Bargaining Unit
 - f. CO- Is there somewhere that shows the percentages for each school
 - i. You could see it in the socio-economic percentages that are pulled from the Free and Reduced lunch form
