
Flinn Scholarship Finalist



He is well respected in our Tanque Verde community, where he has been a long-time resident, and among fellow coaches and former U of A players whose ties run strong in the Tucson community. In his professional career, Jay Dobyns was an undercover federal agent for twenty-seven years before retiring in 2014, and he is now a nationally acclaimed public speaker.

"He continues to surround himself with other high-caliber individuals; coaches who all bring the same infectious positive attitude he exhibits on a consistent basis. January 15, 2020 Governing Board Meeting Highlights

New Teacher Evaluation Framework

Director of Student Services, Ms. Tiffany Hodge, and Superintendent, Dr. Scott Hagerman, presented information regarding the new teacher evaluation tool which will be implemented beginning with the fall semester of school year 2020-2021. After evaluation and review by a committee of teachers and district administration, a modified version of Charlotte Danielson's Framework for Teaching has been selected as the new TVUSD teacher evaluation rubric. In the selection process used to choose the Danielson model, the effect on student learning was the focus, while viability and value to teachers and administrators was also a priority. The modified Danielson model encompasses four domains and eight evaluation components. It is a very flexible model which is aligned with the district's curriculum objectives, and is well suited to the Professional Learning Community (PLC) model recently implemented in TVUSD. The next steps toward implementation will be professional development planning and getting feedback from our school leadership teams, prior to full implementation in the

Each student spoke briefly to the Governing Board about their own personal experience with the STEAM Team. A brief video was played from a recent competition. Students shared a common theme of learning life skills from their STEAM Team experiences: time management, communication, problem solving, research, respecting others and their ideas, and learning how to prioritize. Some hard skills they learned are coding and building. The students expressed their desire to have a STEAM focus in their classrooms. They feel all students would benefit from the experience. Ms. Fry thanked the students and the parents for all of their time and effort, and extended a special thank you to Ms. Kristensen.
