FAITH FORMATION: Class this Wednesday, January 26th at 6:30 pm.

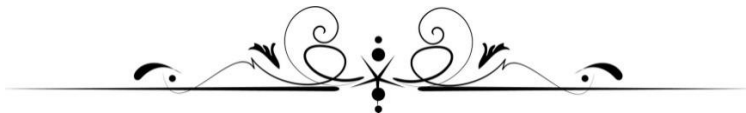
ADULTS FOR CHRIST will meet this Wednesday, January 26, 2022. At 6:30 pm.

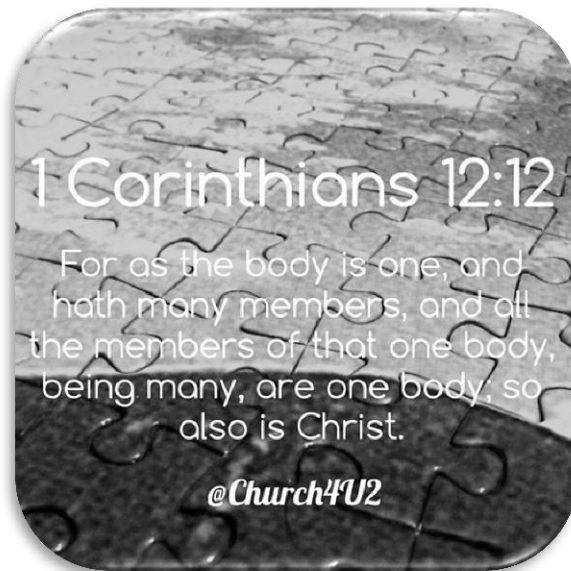

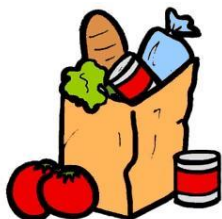


SVDP MEETING: SVdP will meet after the 10:00 Mass on Sunday, February 6th.
