

Perry High School's Air Force Junior ROTC raider team took home, once again, second place in the nation. Early morning on November 5th they took two teams, a mixed and an all-male team, to Molina, Georgia to compete in the Raider All-Service Nationals. Over 50

teams varying from all military JROTC branches competed in four events testing a mixture of strength, agility, and endurance. Between the two Perry teams, they brought home a total of five trophies and they successfully defended their title two years in a row as second in the nation. Chief Robert Spears and Lt. Colonel Greg Bailey are proud of how far the Raider program has progressed in these two years.

Perry began their raider team in 2020. Starting from the ground up, they shadowed events, built their own course and competed in multiple competitions earning more and more ribbons and trophies throughout the season. When they managed to take home second place in the nation for the year 2020, that did not stop them there, if anything it challenged them to work harder and train more each day. This season that hard work payed off. They took home over twenty ribbons, five medals, and sixteen trophies. On top of that, they built an obstacle course and rope bridge area to train on and host their own meets. The 2021 season was very successful for Perry High's JROTC.

FMMS and MCMS FCCLA/FACS Combined Efforts to Provide Snack and Thank You Notes to Healthcare Heroes








A few messages were attached as well:
