

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TK and Kindergarten

Kindergarten students are currently learning high-frequency "tricky" words. To date, they can read words such as *word, why, when, was, from, the, of, to, and one*. They are also exploring phonics patterns, including double consonants at the end of words, and are practicing reading words like *fell, off, and duck*. In addition, students have been working on answering questions using complete sentences and are now progressing to writing their responses. TK students are studying ocean habitats, with a focus on the plants and animals that live in the ocean.

In math, Kindergarten students are learning about teen numbers and developing an understanding of place value. For example, they are learning that the number twelve is composed of one group of ten and two ones. TK students are working on comparing measurements; they used cubes to measure and compare lengths with classmates, which led to meaningful discussions when some measurements were equal.

As a reminder, all students have a goal of reading for 30 minutes each day. At the end of each week, I will share the number of minutes your child has read both in class and at home in their planner as they work toward their personal reading goal.

First and Second Grade Explorers

We have met over 50% of our class Read-a-Thon goal! In order for students to meet their 900 minute individual goal they must read for at least 30 minutes every day, including Saturday and Sunday. Thank you for checking logs carefully and signing them daily!

Students enjoyed their trip to Olympia to watch "Stinky Cheese Man" this week. They also completed St. Patrick's themed math and ELA activities. Students read about wind and built kites which they attempted to fly during pe this week. We also completed a study of what causes spring.

First and second grade students are identifying and counting coins in math. Second grade students are applying concepts of measurement. These are fun, engaging skills to practice at home! How many coins can your child find under the cushions of the couch, in the car, or in your purse? Can s/he count what s/he finds? Can s/he name the coins? If you have a couple rulers or tape measures at home, try a scavenger hunt. Identify things around the house, estimate how long or wide the object is and then measure them in inches and centimeters. Who came the closest to the exact measurement?

Third and Fourth Grade Classroom

This week students finalized their presentations that go along with their powerpoints they created last week. On Thursday we presented these at the GREEN Congress, sharing our water testing results with other students. This allowed for discussions on how to improve local water to make it better for the salmon. This was a great opportunity for students to practice their public speaking skills as well as interact and learn from other students who have also done water quality monitoring.



Remember the Annual Read-A-Thon is going on although I am not collecting homework daily like we do outside of the Read-A-Thon nightly reading is still required. A big congratulations to Kylie and Hemmy who have already hit his individual reading goal and will be receiving a free book of his choosing.
