Dear Parishioners,

This Wednesday marks the beginning of a new school year. I pray that it will be a time of profound growth and learning for our

students, teachers, and staff—and that their enthusiasm for learning will inspire all of us to grow in knowledge and wisdom.

During my first year of major seminary, I had a brief but memorable conversation with Fr. Jan Michael Joncas, best known for the hymn "On Eagle's Wings." He taught at both the University of St. Thomas and the St. Paul Seminary School of Divinity, and I was blessed to have him for several classes.

On that walk, he shared a simple but lasting piece of advice: "To be a good priest, you must learn something about the faith and something about the world every day."

I took his words to heart, making it a daily habit to note what I had learned. But this is not just good advice for seminarians or priests—it's for everyone. We are all called to deepen our understanding of the faith, even in small ways—perhaps by learning about a saint, a Scripture passage, or a moral teaching. And learning about the wider world is equally important.

I offer his simple challenge to you as we begin this year: learn something about your faith and something about the world every day.

If you follow St. Edward's on Facebook, you may have noticed increased activity. The Diocese of New Ulm has provided access to a Catholic social media resource, and their staff create posts we can share—ranging from reflections on Our Lady of the Prairie to saints of the day and Gospel meditations.

These posts have been well received, so we will continue to share

them regularly.


