


CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS



ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE


Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.


ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2014-15.




FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

Clatskanie Middle High School strives to promote student success by focusing on positive student relationships, regular attendance at school, serving all students based on needs, increased academic rigor across all subject areas, and development of family and community partnerships. Through this work, CMHS has experienced an 8% increase with students " On Track to Graduate" which is currently exceeding the state of Oregon average and an increase of 14% of students being "College Bound."

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% ontime, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.







