 - A. Accept the Election results for the authorization to impose a technology fund levy in the sum of Twenty thousand Seven hundred and Twenty-Five DOLLARS (\$20,725) per year for ten (10) years and being approximately 8.32 mills, for the purpose of purchasing, renting, repairing and maintaining technological equipment? Equipment includes computers and computer network access, cloud computing services for technology infrastructure, platform, software, network, storage, security, data, database, test environment curriculum, or desktop virtualization purposes, including any subscription or any license-based or pay-per-use service that is accessed over the internet or other remote network to meet the district's information technology and other needs, and the associated technical training for school district personnel. Passage of this proposal will increase the taxes on a home with an assessed market value of \$100,000 by approximately \$11.24, on a home with an assessed market value of \$300,000 by approximately \$33.71, and on a home with a market value of \$600,000 by approximately \$67.43. An increase in property taxes may lead to an increase in rental costs.
 - B. Accept the Election results for the authorization to impose a building reserve levy in the amount of Forty-five thousand DOLLARS (\$45,000) for one (1) year which is approximately 18.07 mills, for the purpose of repairing, equipping, maintaining, and operating the school buildings. Passage of this proposal will increase the taxes on a home with a market value of \$100,000 by approximately \$24.40, on a home with a market value of \$300,000 by approximately \$73.20, and on a home with a market value of \$600,000 by approximately \$146.40. An increase in property taxes may lead to an increase in rental costs.
 - C. Accept by acclamation the Election results to elect one (1) trustee, Brian Gallup, for a three (3) year term in accordance with 20-20-416 and 20-3-307 MCA.

Citizens may comment on items appearing on the agenda when invited to participate during that agenda item by the Board Chair. Citizens may comment on items related to School District business not appearing on this agenda during the public comment portion of the meeting. Public meetings may be recorded or broadcast by citizens in accordance with Montana law. Citizens broadcasting or recording a meeting are encouraged to notify the board chair so appropriate accommodations and notifications can be made.

Montana law requires school districts and other public agencies to include on the agenda for public meetings an item allowing public comment on any ***public matter not otherwise specifically listed on the agenda*** that is within the jurisdiction of the agency. As has also been the practice of the District, and in accordance with Montana law, if any Board or public representative desires to speak to an item that is ***specifically listed/identified on the agenda***, you will be allowed to do so at the discretion of the Board chairperson when the item comes up for discussion and action. The public comment portion of the agenda is not the time designated to hear items that are specifically listed/identified on the agenda.

For those individuals who desire to address the Board during the “public comment” portion of the meeting, if you haven’t already done so, please sign your name to the sheet located on the table and indicate the general topic on which you will be commenting. The Board Chairman will call individuals to speak in the order listed on the sheet provided. The Board would like to remind everyone in attendance that to avoid violations of individual rights of privacy, a member of the public wishing to address the Board during this time will not be allowed to make comments about any student, staff member, or member of the general public during his/her designated time to speak. In addition, the Board will not hear comments on contested cases or other adjudicative proceedings.

Depending on the number of persons who wish to address the Board, the Board Chairman may place reasonable time limits on comments, in order to maintain and ensure effective and efficient operations of the Board.

By law the District cannot take any action on any matter discussed during the “public comment” portion of the meeting, until such time as the matter is specifically noticed on the agenda, and the public has been allowed the opportunity to comment.

Board meetings are open to the public, but not a public meeting.
