








Ed Bethea Returns As The Board Chair For HCDNNJ Board of Directors in 2025

Paulsboro PRIDE Neighborhood Plan Team Hosts Breakfast With Santa



Join Our Foster Grandparent Program


Our Foster Grandparent Program offers the comfort and love that help set a child on a path to a successful future.

Lead Education Event At Hamilton 1 Head Start











Gateway's Hamilton 1 Head Start hosted a "Lead Education 101" presentation for parents during their monthly meeting on January 8. Guest speakers included Mathew Manthey, the Environmental Specialist and Lead-Based Paint Inspector-Risk Assessor-Program Coordinator from the Central NJ Lead & Healthy Homes Coalition of the Monmouth County Health Department, and Georgeanne Taylor, the Nurse Case Manager for the Lead Program (top right photo). They educated parents about sources of lead exposure, how to keep children safe from lead in their environment, and the negative effects high lead levels have on children's physical and cognitive development.

The Hamilton Health Department also attended the presentation, providing information and answering questions about lead services available within the township.


