In the Little Gym, the HS will be having a night to honor our students starting at 5:00. Cake and punch to be served afterwards.




Spring Sports Are Coming to an End







"New Preschool Structure Beginning in the 2022-23 School Year"



We have exciting news for the 2022-23 school year! The Pe Ell School District will be offering Transitional Kindergarten for four year olds. This program will be an all-day, tuition free program. To qualify for this program, a child must be four years old by September 1.

We will be advertising for a full time certificated teacher to teach this class.

Unfortunately, the district will not be offering our current program that combines three and four year olds part time four days a week. The exception to the program will be three-year-old students who qualify for special education services.
