

Just a Reminder...We are seeing an

increase in Flu and Strep Throat cases in our area. Please keep your children home, (or take them to the doctor if necessary) if they are sick, have a fever of 100 degrees or higher, have an unusual rash, have vomiting or diarrhea, have a headache, and/or are displaying other symptoms of general illness.

Please remember that children cannot return to school until they have been fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication. Children also cannot return to school until they have had no vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours without medication. If students are diagnosed with strep throat, they must be on antibiotics for 24 hours in addition to being fever free for 24 hours before returning to school. If your child has been diagnosed with Flu, Strep, or any other contagious condition, or if you have any questions or concerns, please contact Nurse Peters at (843)563-3231 as soon as possible for further guidance or clarification.
