9TH GRADE

Freshmen enroll in **Western Civilizations I**, a full-year course that explores the emergence and growth of the Western world. Students study the development of early civilizations nearly 6,000 years ago through the Age of Exploration in the 1500s. Other topics studied include Ancient Greece & Rome, Medieval Europe, the Renaissance, and the Reformation.

In addition to the content covered, many skills are emphasized, including:

- Critical Thinking
- Reading
- Writing
- Research
- · Public Speaking
- Geography
- Primary Source Analysis

Parents and students are advised to follow the recommendation of their 8th grade teacher when completing the course selection process. This course is offered at Honors, Academic, and General levels.



COURSE SEQUENCE

The typical student will take the following sequence of courses at RHHS:

10th Grade

- Western Civilizations II (Fall) a continuation of European civilization through the beginning of the 20th century
- Civics (Spring) the study of American government, with a focus on the foundations, traditions, and operations of the federal system. This course is required for graduation.

11th Grade

 United States History (Full Year) - a survey of American history, from its founding to the present day. This course is required for graduation.

12th Grade

- 20th Century American Culture & Society* (Spring)
- American & World Politics (Full Year)
- African American & Latino Studies* (Full Year)
- Current Issues (Full Year)
- Psychology* (Fall/Spring)
