HS Yearbook Class Social-Emotional Learning Education Project

The High School Yearbook Class is continuing their year-long PBL Project on socialemotional learning to teach families of the district about seven-character strengths students need these days.

Character Strength #6: Empathy

Empathy is having the ability to understand and share the feelings of another person. There are many ways parents can teach or practice empathy with their children. Some ways include showing empathy yourself by being more sensitive to your child's feelings or helping your children develop self-control to handle and express their feelings appropriately. By being sensitive to your child's feelings, you can help them understand how other people are feeling. A lot of times when children don't express empathy, it's not because they don't have it but don't know how to show it. Often the ability to care for others is overwhelmed by other emotions, such as anger, shame, envy, etc., so that makes it hard to be empathetic.

Character Strength #7: Self-confidence

Self-confidence is the confidence you have in yourself and what you think of oneself. Selfconfidence is something every person should

Don't criticize them for their mistakes but rather teach them to correct the mistakes.
Don't point out the things they dislike

Don't point out the things they dislike about themselves but help them to like those things.

Don't show favoritism for one/some of your kids over your other kids. Show that you are proud of ALL your kids. Don't dislike what your kids like to do but rather try to see why they like those things.

Encourage your kids in order to boost their self-confidence.
