The Brimfield Board of Education held its regular meeting on Wednesday, August 11, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. in the High School commons. Board President Updyke called the meeting to order with the following members present: Coyle, Meyer, Snyder, Bell, Graham, and Johnson.

The board recognized and thanked all visitors for attending.

Board President Updyke welcomed comments from the community members.

Cindy Sloan, Peter Huang, Steve Thurman, Brianna Murdock, Nate Hamilton, Josh Murdock, Jarrod Schlipf, Dave Hicke, and Fawn Kieser all opined against the Governor's mask mandate and urged the Board to not follow the mandate. After 30 minutes had passed, Meyer moved and Bell seconded to extend the public comments session for an additional 30 minutes. Motion Carried.

Brent Kieser was next, followed by Matt Gillespie, Courtney Strahm, Kelly Bizosky, Dave Hicke (Jade Wagenbach yielded her time), Anna Heinz, and Sam Hoerr. All voiced their disapproval of the mask mandate and also urged the Board to not follow the mandate. After 30 minutes had passed, Johnson moved and Snyder seconded to extend the public comments session for an additional 30 minutes. Motion Carried.

Tara Binder was the last to voice her opinion against the mask mandate.

Updyke reported. He appreciates all the summer workers and custodians for all they have done. He loves the inside and outside updates to the Grade School.

Superintendent Shinall reported on his board report. He was very appreciative of all involved with the rollout of online registration. He briefed the board on the tentative budget. We will be receiving just under \$20k of additional funds for Evidence-Based Funding. Lastly, he briefed the Board on returning to school.

High School Principal Robison reported. He shared how he has learned how much of a family atmosphere we have here! He is excited for the new employees to get started. He explained that schedule changes can still take place through the first week of school. He explained the 'trust the process slogan' for this year and reminded us all how important it is to BE ELITE.

Grade School Principal Albritton reported. She briefed the Board on Summer school attendance as well as the areas of growth and improvement. She elaborated on registration turnout thus far. There will be an Open House on August 17<sup>th</sup>; Teacher Institute days are on August 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>. Lastly, she explained the completed summer maintenance projects and directed attention to the pictures included with her report.

There was new business to discuss/approve.

Johnson moved and Bell seconded to approve the Review of Closed Session Meeting Minutes.

Superintendent Shinall referenced two documents that were distributed to Board members. The first was a letter he received that afternoon from the State Superintendent detailing ISBE's position on the Executive Order. The expectation of ISBE was for districts to follow the Executive Order. This letter detailed the consequences of not following the Executive Order, including a change in the district's recognition with ISBE. If remediation was unsuccessful, the letter detailed this would lead to a loss of recognition, meaning a loss to access to state funding and the loss of the ability to participate in athletic contests sanctioned by the Illinois Elementary School Association and the Illinois High School Association. The second document was the professional recommendation of Superintendent Shinall to follow the Executive Order. A list of possible outcomes of not following the Executive Order were listed in this letter as well.

Meyer moved, contingent on possible changes, and Bell seconded to approve the Revised Return to School Plan. After much discussion the recommended changes were:

- Meyer moved and Bell seconded to approve striking the verbiage, under contact tracing: "...and are vaccinated." Roll Call: Meyer yes, Bell yes, Johnson no, Snyder yes, Graham yes, Coyle yes, Updyke no.

- Meyer moved and Bell seconded to approve the verbiage "who are in close contact and symptomatic" under Quarantine Staff per directive.

Bell shared that he has knowledge of a legal battle over the masking debate and related threats. Bell believes we should undertake some risk due to the ease of course change if the COVID-19 threat is severe enough. Coyle believes ignoring the masks in Mitigation Tier one is a risk worth taking. Updyke explained the severity of the risks, the amount of funding at stake, the importance of recognition loss, insurance liability, and personal liability. Johnson appreciates everyone attending and strongly expressed why it is so important that we follow the mandate. Roll Call: Meyer – yes, Bell – yes, Johnson – no, Snyder – yes, Graham – yes, Coyle – yes, Updyke – no. Motion carried

Meyer moved and Johnson seconded to approve the Consolidated District Plan. Superintendent Shinall explained that all of our grant funding is contingent on the completion and approval of this plan.
