

Dear Teacher,

Thank you so much for downloading my 2nd Grade Pearson Reading Street Benchmark Reviews. I personally use these with my 2nd graders and have discovered a significant increase in my students' scores on their unit assessments!

You will find that each unit's review includes both a PDF and a PNG format. You will also recognize that each benchmark review was created with questions formatted and aligned with the assessments covering the skills taught throughout each unit. This allows the teacher to bring attention to similar examples their students will see on the test.

PDF:

The PDF is the version I recommend if you are interested in printing the slides from each review. Some teachers prefer to use a printed version while working with a small group of students or to incorporate a Kagan Structure. However, I would like to remind you that in order to keep your students engaged, the slides are full of colorful clipart and backgrounds. With that being said, I would recommend you using your local office supply store to print them on card stock to save your personal ink. Another recommendation for saving your personal ink is to print them in gray scale or send to a copier if your computer is on a network. Personally, I prefer to import the PDF format into my ActivInspire software. I have discovered when I review in a whole group setting the specific section, or sections, that my students are tested on for that day, their scores are much higher.

Directions for importing a PDF into your ActivInspire software includes the following steps:

- 1. Click File.
- 2. Choose import PDF.
- 3. Select the unit review that you wish to use.

(SmartBoard users should follow instructions for importing a PDF if they choose to review in a whole group setting.)

PNG:

The PNG format is provided for teachers to open in their Microsoft Office suite. My recommendation is to view the slides in a slideshow.
