



# Welcome to our Title I Program Annual Public Meeting 2023-2024

- Supplies and Materials for Parent and Family Engagement


## **Every Student Succeeds Act or ESSA**


**Parents Right to Know**

## **Assessments**


Our school must assess student progress toward proficiency:
