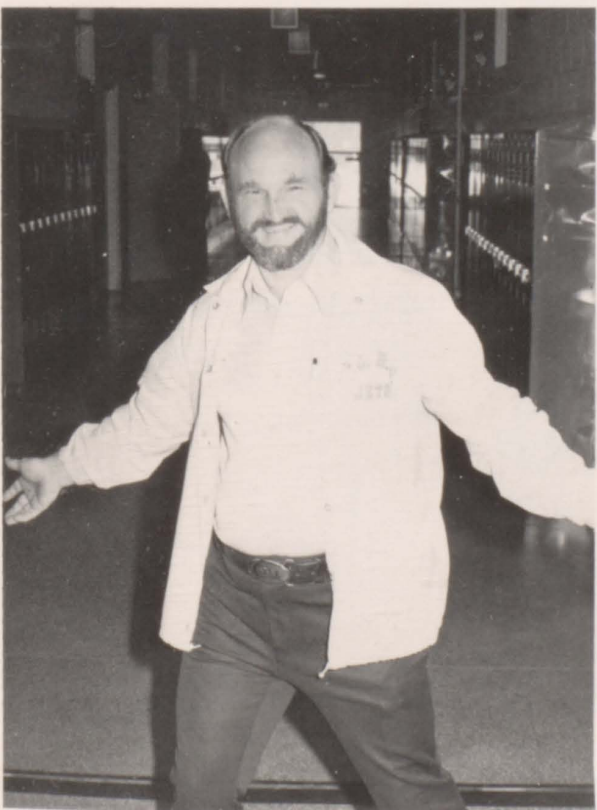
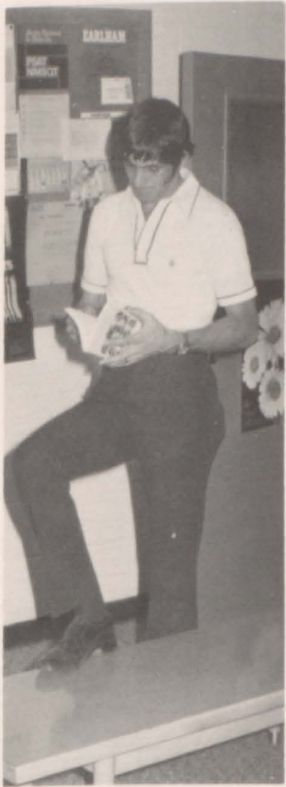
This year the publication staff decided to honor a "teacher of the year." We found however, that we were unable to select just one from the many outstanding teachers we have at CCHS . . . After much deliberation, we wish to say a special "Thank you" to two special people . . . Kay Fisher and Judy Quillen.


Both Mrs. Fisher and Mrs. Quillen are dedicated teachers. They enjoy their profession and take a personal interest in their students. They believe that if a student fails, the teacher has failed. Both teachers make their classes interesting and enjoyable while challenging students to do their very best.

Mrs. Quillen came to CCHS from South Carolina. She has been teaching here for six years. Mrs. Quillen is a very energetic person. Besides her classroom work she has been a lead sponsor for the Junior class and head of the English Dept. Mrs. Quillen has two daughters; Laura, a CCHS graduate, and Becky — a 1979 Senior. Her husband works with the Tennessee Wildlife Resource Agency. In her spare time Mrs. Quillen likes to read and sew.

Mrs. Fisher came here from Dallas, Texas three years ago. In this short span of time she has become a vital part of CCHS. She was the lead sponsor for the 1978 graduating class and currently is chairman of the English Dept. When Mrs. Fisher isn't teaching she takes care of Sharon, who is a Senior, and Scott, a 9th grader.







Teachers . . . you saw them for 175 days during the year, but did you really know them? For instance, did you realize that they averaged 7 years of teaching experience at C.C.H.S., and 11.6 years of total teaching experience? They were smart . . . as all have degrees and 48 percent have degrees beyond the Bachelor's degree. Some were involved: 42 percent worked with activities, averaging one activity each, even if 70 percent were married and had their own family interests. Most teachers (86 percent) grew up in Tennessee, while 51 percent were reared in Cumberland County. One-fourth came here from other states and 1 person from a foreign country. Salary — were they overpaid? Underpaid? This staff averaged a salary of \$9,900 and believe it or not (did you notice the good looks? or all the grey hair . . .) they averaged 33 years of age.

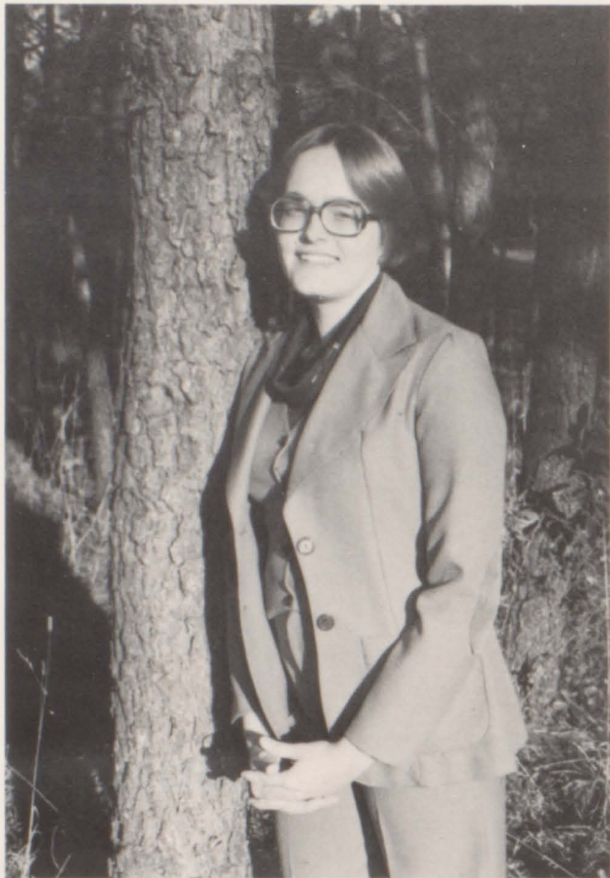

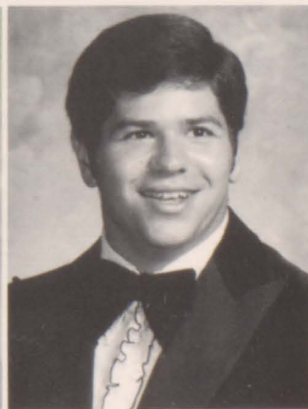

Brent's future plans include furthering his education and majoring in agriculture. He plans to attend his first two years of college at Martin College in Pulaski, Tenn.



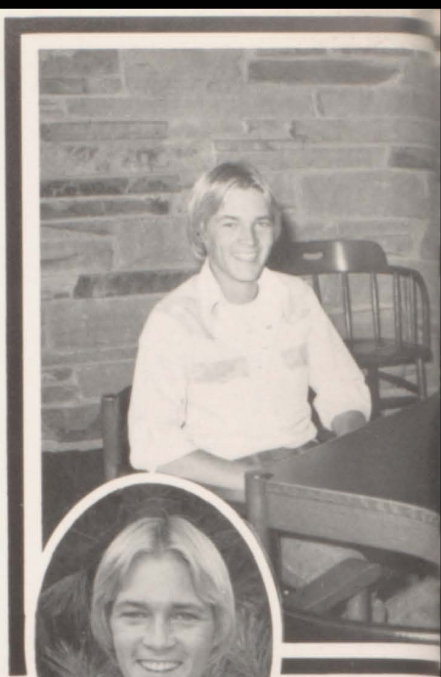

Pam Kendrick, Valedictorian for the Class of '79, is one of those people who never seem to give up. She is an active participant in school activities and a serious student.

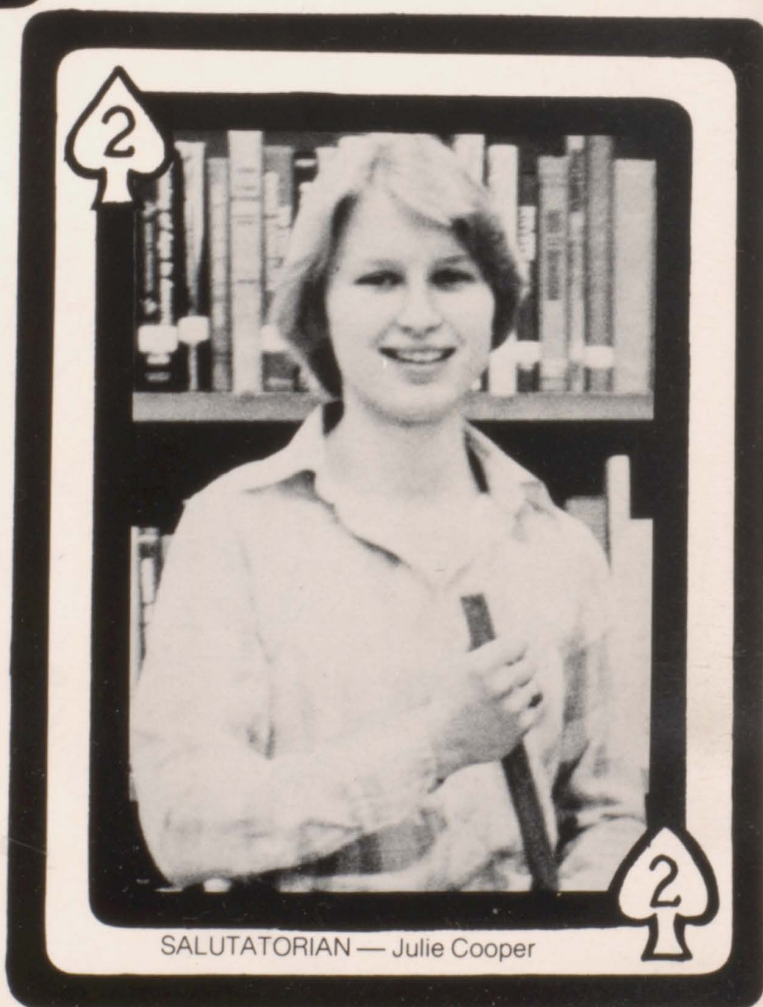

Future Jet football stars will include Tommy Holder, David Crace, Larry Long, Rodney French, and Vernon Patton.



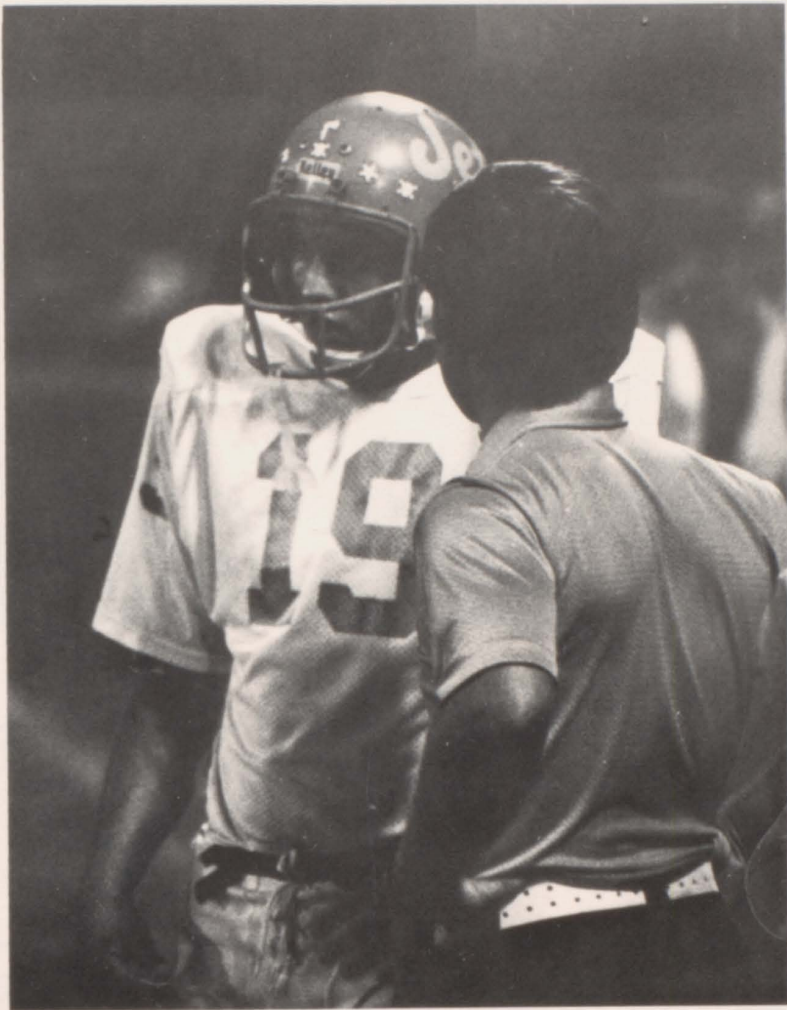

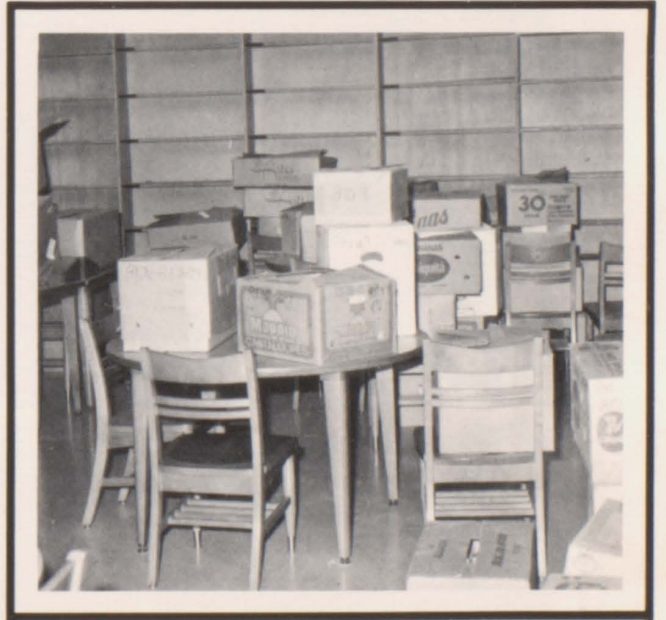
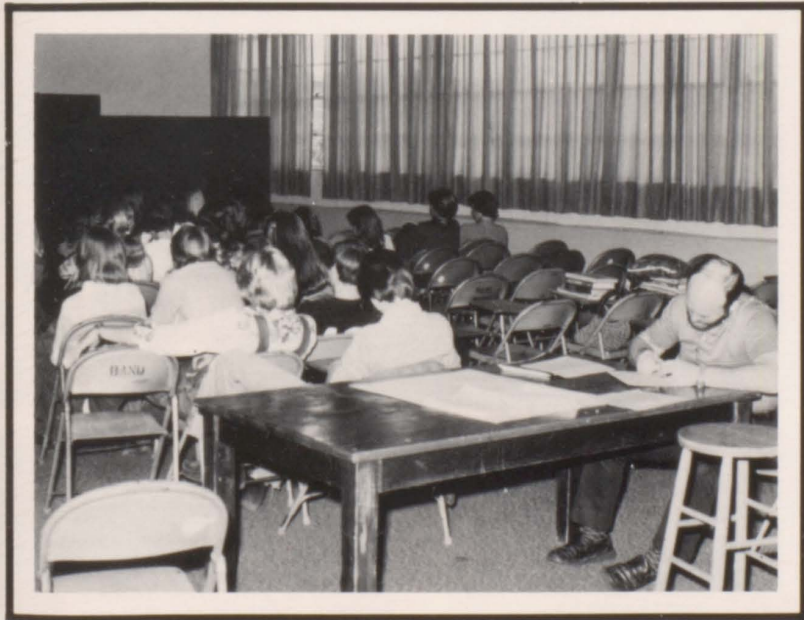
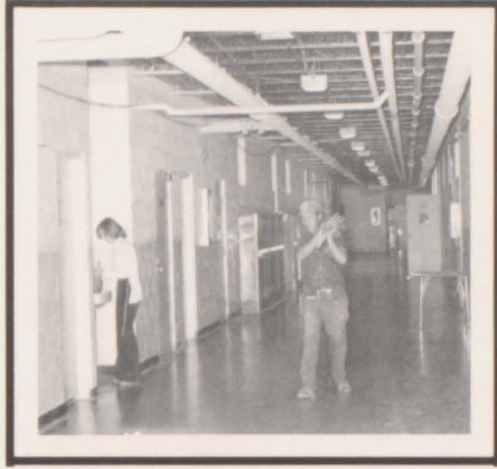


Several noticeable changes took place at C.C.H.S. during the 1978-79 school year, including new ceilings, doors, lights and an expanded library. Carpenters, ladders and scaffolds were as much a part of a regular school day as teachers, books and pencils. Why all the renovations? These changes and countless others are due to our application for accreditation by the Southern Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges. The secondary school will improve the physical appearance of our school, and the quality of education here at C.C.H.S. as well. Lowered student ratios and planning periods for teachers are both requirements for accreditation which increase the effectiveness of teachers in the classrooms.

The task of turning over a new leaf started last year and continued throughout the summer vacation. Faculty members divided into committees to study every aspect of school life, report deficiencies, and make recommendations. Retired educator and former C.C.H.S. teacher, Woodrow Wilson headed the steering committee. Other committees included School and Community, Philosophy and Objectives, Student Activities, Guidance, Educational Media, School facilities, Administration and Staff, Curriculum, Vocational Education, Arts and Music, Business, Math, Social Studies, English, Science, Driver Safety, and Special Education. Teachers put in many after school hours evaluating our ability to meet S.A.S.S.C. requirements.

A visiting committee, consisting of 24 educators from across the state and headed by Dr. O. C. Stewart of Tennessee Tech, spent 3 days in Crossville April 16-18. They met with the local committees and visited C.C.H.S. to make their own assessments of our capacity to fulfill Southern Association standards. This group summarized our recommendations and made their own recommendations. We will continue to work on deficiencies throughout the year and, a hearing in December of 1979 will determine whether our school will be accredited by the Southern Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges.

Although countless modifications and renovations were made this year, more are expected in the future. New lockers, improved dressing room facilities and cafeteria facilities, and a complete facelift are just a few alterations anticipated in the next few years.
