In closing, your child's education is extremely important to us. In order to be successful in school, regular attendance is necessary. **DID YOU KNOW:**

- > Students who do not learn the fundamentals of reading, writing and math by 3rd grade are more likely to fall behind and less likely to graduate from high school;
- > Students who attend school regularly show higher levels of achievement than students who do not have regular attendance;
- ➤ Good attendance helps children do well in high school, college and at work;
- > Students who miss fewer days become better readers;
- > Students who have excessive absences are more likely to be suspended and drop out of high school;
- Research shows chronic absenteeism is linked to teen substance use and poor health as adults;
- > Students who miss more than 18 days of school are less proficient in reading, writing, and math compared to their peers with good attendance;
- Regular daily attendance positively impacts a child's social, emotional, and cognitive development;
- > 80% of success in school is simply just showing up!
