Upcoming Solar Eclipse: As I wrote to you earlier this week, next Monday, April 8th, we will have a partial eclipse, similar to the one in August of 2017.

- The following is a two-page handout distributed by the National Science Teacher Association: SolarEclipse_Handout.pdf. It helps explain the eclipse and ways to observe it safely.
 - Students have been informed about the eclipse in their classrooms.
- Each student will receive a special set of eclipse glasses on Monday that MUST be worn while LOOKING UP AT THE SKY walking home, on the school bus, and during the eclipse, from 2:15-4:30 pm on Monday, to protect their eyes.
 - Please remind your children of the importance of keeping the glasses on during the entire time of the eclipse, if they are outdoors and want to look at the eclipse.
 - As an extra precaution, Mrs. Noubleau, Mrs. Johnson, and I will each be riding a school bus to be sure students are wearing their glasses when needed. We will be stopping the bus for a few minutes to look at the peak of the eclipse around 3:25 pm.
